# Call to Worship

Galatians 5: 13-14, 16-24

New International Reader's Version

My brothers and sisters, you were chosen to be free. But don't use your freedom as an excuse to live under the power of sin. Instead, serve one another in love. The whole law is fulfilled by obeying this one command. "Love your neighbor as you love yourself."

So, I say, live by the Holy Spirit's power. Then you will not do what your desires controlled by sin want you to do. The desires controlled by sin do not want what the Spirit delights in. And the Spirit does not want what the desires controlled by sin delight in. The two are at war with each other. That's why you are not supposed to do whatever you want.

But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the authority of the law.

The result of sin's control in our lives is clear. It includes sexual sins, impure acts, and wild living. It includes worshiping statues of gods and worshiping evil powers. It also includes hatred and fighting, jealousy and fits of anger. Sinful desire is interested only in getting ahead. It stirs up trouble.

It separates people into their own little groups. It wants what others have. It gets drunk and takes part in wild parties. It does many things of that kind. I warn you now as I did before. People who live like this will not receive God's kingdom.

But the fruit the Holy Spirit produces is love, joy and peace. It is being patient, kind and good.



It is being faithful and gentle and having control of oneself. There is no law against things of that kind. Those who belong to Christ Jesus have nailed their sinful desires to his cross. They don't want these things anymore.

Today, Father, we thank you for the **freedom** you provide through your Son Jesus Christ.

## Reading about the Word of the Day

Paul says in Romans 6 that you and I are “set free from sin.”

How are we set free? By the cross of Christ. You’re set free so that you never again need to respond when sin calls. God has thoroughly defeated sin and Satan, so that when the enemy beckons, we need never tremble. The issue was settled when Christ died, when he dealt with sin and set you free.

Freedom from the clutches of sin has been won for us at great price on the cross.

But you still have to choose.

Is there any area of your life where you sense that you are not absolutely free? If that is true, then release that area of your life—and all your life—to the truth of God.

“If you abide in My word, you shall be my disciples indeed. And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall set you free.”

John 8:31-32

Ask Him to help you understand His truth and live it out. As you do, your life will become a powerful demonstration of what God did on the cross to deal with sin... Sin no longer has dominion over you, and you are free—totally, joyfully, completely free—in Christ.

## Scripture Reading

2 Cor 3: 12-18 NCV

We have this hope, so we are very bold. We are not like Moses, who put a covering over his face so the Israelites would not see it. The glory was disappearing, and Moses did not want them to see it end. But their minds were closed, and even today that same covering hides the meaning when they read the old agreement.

That covering is taken away only through Christ. When a person changes and follows the Lord, that covering is taken away.

The Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. Our faces, then, are not covered. We all show the Lord's glory, and we are being changed to be like him. This change in us brings ever greater glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit.

Leader and People

**Leader:** Here is my servant, whom I uphold,

**People:** In faithfulness he will bring forth  
justice; he will not falter or be discouraged  
till he establishes justice on earth.

**Leader:** He will be a light for the Gentiles, to open eyes that are blind, to free captives from prison and to release from the dungeon those who sit in darkness.

*Is 42: 1,4, 6-7*

**People:** This is what the LORD says: “In the time of my favor I will answer you, and in the day of salvation I will help you. Say to the captives, ‘Come out,’ and to those in darkness, ‘Be free!’ He who has compassion on them will guide them and lead them beside springs of water. *Is 48: 8,9,10*

**Leader:** It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery.

*Gal 5:1*

**Together:** You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love.

*Gal 5:13*

**Leader:** Therefore, rid yourselves of all malice and all deceit, hypocrisy, envy, and slander of every kind. Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation, now that you have tasted that the Lord is good.

*1 Pet 2:1-3*

**Together:** Be subject for the Lord's sake to every human institution. For this is the will of God, that by doing good you should put to silence the ignorance of foolish people. Live as people who are free, not using your freedom as a cover-up for evil but living as servants of God. Honor everyone. Love the brotherhood. Fear God.

**Leader:** To the Jews who had believed him, Jesus said, “If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.”

*Jn 8:31-32*

**People:** They answered him, “We are Abraham’s descendants and have never been slaves of anyone. How can you say that we shall be set free?”

*Jn 8:33*

**Leader:** Jesus replied, “Very truly I tell you, everyone who sins is a slave to sin. Now a slave has no permanent place in the family, but a son belongs to it forever. So, if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed. *Jn 8:34-35*

**People:** For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that we should no longer be slaves to sin. *Rom 6:6,14*

**Leader:** Count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus. For sin shall no longer be your master, because you are not under the law, but under grace. *Rom 6: 11, 14*

**Together:** But thanks be to God that, though we used to be slaves to sin, we have come to obey from the heart the pattern of teaching that has now claimed our allegiance. We have been set free from sin and have become slaves to righteousness.

*from Rom 6:17-18*

**Together:** If the Son makes you free, you will be truly free.

*Jn 8:36*
