#### **PRAYERS & SQUARES MINISTRY**

Prayers and Squares is an international, interfaith outreach ministry that combines the gift of prayer with the gift of a handmade and hand-tied quilt. The purpose of the quilts is not to make and distribute quilts but to promote prayer through the use of quilts. The motto is "It is not about the quilt but about the prayers." As each knot is tied, a prayer is offered for a person who is in need due to health issues, or other issues.

The finished quilt goes to that person as a silent testimony to our belief in the power of prayer. These quilts truly can be called "comforters".

Before you request a prayer quilt, please contact the person or a family member to see if the person wants a prayer quilt.

- 1. Name of the person who will receive the quilt.

- 3. What information about the person who needs our prayers (Such as recovering from surgery, requests for prayers of healing, health issues) can be placed in the bulletin.

We may need a week or two before we can place a quilt in church to make the quilt and have it ready for the church service.

Thank you to all who request prayer quilts and say prayers and tie knots in each quilt. "We may not know why or who needs a prayer quilt, but God knows and will hear our prayers for the recipient."


