Meet Emily Phenice, Duke Intern

She was born and raised in Lake Charles, Louisiana. Growing up, Emily loved attending Uskichitto Retreat Center, a local United Methodist summer camp. When she was 12 years old, she became a counselor-in-training, or CIT, at her summer camp, where she would help the counselors with the younger first-time campers for a week. In 2018, Emily became a counselor at the camp and worked there for the summers of 2018 and 2019. In 2020, Emily received a phone call for a job she had interviewed for and turned down a year ago, asking her to go and work there. Believing that this was a message from God, she went to Tahoe, California, to work for the summer. While working at that job, Emily was told that women could not be pastors for the church and was not allowed to share the message of Scripture with the children she was working with. Even when a kid walked up to her and directly asked her a question, the kid was taken away from her, and the question was shut down. This deeply hurt Emily and even caused her to walk away from the church for the rest of the summer. Upon her return to her hometown, the associate pastor and her old camp counselor took her out to lunch and offered her the job as an intern for the youth group. During this lunch, Emily realized that the church was good, and that her experience, while not uncommon, was not what or who the church truly was. This experience in Tahoe gave her the reason and passion for the work she hopes to do within the church, and in her goal to reach those who are not comfortable in the church due to past church hurt.

In 2022, Emily received her Bachelor's in Science degree in Elementary Education at McNeese State University, while she also worked as a substitute teacher and taught 2nd grade. She continued to teach post-graduation as an art teacher at the local elementary school and began serving as the Assistant Youth Director in the local church. Emily continued to follow her calling, which led her to work in Oxford, Mississippi at Oxford University United Methodist Church, where she helped with the 456, 4th-6th grade program. When Emily was growing up, she loved going to camp and later became a camp counselor. Her work at the camp and at OUUMC helped her to realize her call into ministry. Emily is currently a certified candidate for ordination in the Mississippi Conference, with the hope of being ordained as an Elder in the future. Emily feels called to bring the local church out into the world and reimagine what church on a Sunday morning could look like. In her free time, she enjoys cooking, sewing, hiking, and reading.
