Radical Authenticity

"To some who were confident of their own righteousness and looked down on everyone else,

Jesus told this parable"

-Luke 18:9-

In the parable the lectionary brings us this week, Jesus contrasts the intentions of a Pharisee and a tax collector. The first confesses before God as a good person, relying on the righteousness of his deeds. The second confesses himself a sinner before God, doubts himself and his rectitude. As we know, Jesus praises the tax collector and sets him forth as a model of piety.

This was shocking not only to people of his time but even to us today. Don't actions weigh more than intentions? Isn't this subverting a society's good values? What are Jesus's intentions in saying such things? Fortunately, the text reveals those intentions. Jesus addresses the parable "To some who were confident of their own righteousness and looked down on everyone else."

This shows us that Jesus seeks to remedy a society in which we do not usually see others as equals, even though we are all sinners and share the same weaknesses. It is true that there are people, like the tax collector, who do social wrong, but a sense of moral superiority will not help such people improve, nor will it enable our society to be morally rehabilitated. Jesus understood this very well and, through the tax collector who is justified before God, gave us a lesson: the life of faith requires a sincere and radical authenticity.

The lack of authenticity appears in small things: we nod to avoid conflict even when we disagree; we laugh at a joke that didn't amuse us; we post only the "presentable" on social media and hide our fatigue; we say "it's fine" when it hurt; we offer compliments out of obligation or hit "like" out of reciprocity; we pretend to be fine so as not to worry others. And of course, as in the parable, we tend not to acknowledge mistakes, not to confess sins, not to say "I was wrong," in order to avoid the discomfort of a rebuke or confrontation. These may seem like minimal, trivial gestures, but together they train us to live more for approval than for truth and mutual understanding.

Jesus invites us, on the contrary, to show ourselves as we are, even if that means showing our weakness. Moreover, the authenticity we can cultivate in the intimacy of prayer can also become a public and relational habit. In a page of his journal titled "Four Resolutions," John Wesley made a vow to God: "To use absolute openness and unreserve with all I should converse with." I believe this resolution invites us to embody the spirituality of the tax collector whom Jesus praised, in order to create networks of relationships that can welcome the conversion of sinners and rehabilitate people socially in a spirit of equality and fraternity.
