RefugeeMinistry - Welcome Circles Information:

Did you know that 1 in 74 people worldwide is displaced? And that 330,000 people each year come to the US through government programs as refugees? Jesus says when we welcome the stranger we have welcomed him (Matt 25). We have an opportunity to welcome refugees in our midst by forming Welcome Circles for new families settling in our area. We are especially blessed because we have the Orange Cooperative Parish, which has seven United Methodist Churches working together, with many skills and resources that could help families who come as refugees.

What is a Welcome Circle? A Welcome Circle is a group of individuals who provide financial, resettlement, and emotional support to newcomers for six months to a year until they reach self-sufficiency. Circles can form as part of a synagogue, organization, community center, church or interfaith community, or they can be made up of private individuals. Most circles have 5-8 core members who lead on different tasks, such as finding housing, signing up for benefits, helping enroll children in school, and assisting adults with job readiness and employment.

Who will be helping us? The families are welcomed through HAIS, originally the Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society. They have been helping resettle families for years, and have lots of resources and staff to help assist and answer questions.

<u>Where do these families come from?</u> The families we may help resettle are legal refugees who apply and gain refugee status through the government. They come from around the world, and have many different backgrounds and stories.

<u>I'm interested! How can I help?</u> We will have an interest meeting to answer more questions and discern together on Tuesday, October 3rd, at 7 PM at Cedar Grove United Methodist Church, located at 5218 Efland-Cedar Grove Road, Cedar Grove, NC. We are about 10 minutes North of Efland.

Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Project Return deadline 10/1

We blessed and excited that Walnut Grove UMC has approved our participation in the Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Project this year!

There are numerous ways to participate:

1) Pick up a box from the Operation Christmas Child Table in the fellowship for your family to purchase items and fill. Each box will have a label inside for you to place on the box and check which sex/age child your box goes to. Return your shoebox to a container located underneath the table on or before October 1, 2023. The shipping and administrative cost is \$10 per box. Please follow the directions on the label for donations. Please put the portion of the label regarding shipping costs inside/top of box. DO NOT BURY IT DOWN IN THE BOX!!!!! If you pick up a box to be filled, PLEASE write your name and contact information on the signup sheet on OCC table so that an inventory can be kept.

- 2) Purchase items from lists provided in the weekly e-mail and e-Nutshell. There will large boxes underneath the OCC table for you to leave those items as you bring them in. The sooner the better as shoeboxes will be filled as we receive appropriate items!
- 3) If you prefer not to shop and would like to contribute funds, you may give those funds directly to me and I will do the shopping for you. If you have a specific area that you prefer your funds to be used, please let me know.
- 4) You may put money in the offering plate on any Sunday morning. Be sure to designate it for Operation Christmas Child Project. Those funds will be used to buy any additional items needed to fill boxes and/or for shipping costs.
- 5) And, most of all, please remember to **say a prayer** for the children who will receive these shoeboxes.

Suggested Items for Each Box:

- "WOW" ITEMS such as soccer balls (deflated) with pump; dolls; stuffed animals or shoes (Note, each box should contain one WOW item!)
- 2) TOYS such as toy cars, jump ropes, yo-yos, cards, or dominos
- 3) TOILITRIES such as tooth brushes, combs, brushes, soap (individually wrapped!), stick deodorant, wash cloths
- 4) SCHOOL SUPPLIES such as pens, pencils, sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks, paper, coloring books, picture books, solar calculators
- 5) ACCESSORIES such as socks, sunglasses, jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries), caps, t-shirts, underwear

Do Not Include:

Candy, toothpaste, gum, seeds, food, liquids, lotions, aerosol cans, glass containers, breakable items, scary or war-related items, or used or damaged items!
