Some middle schoolers are reading Linda Park's book, A Long Walk to Water. I ordered two copies, one for myself too. While the Amazon truck delivered it yesterday and I haven't read it yet, the cover of a person with a jug in the heat reminds me of a biblical story familiar to us all from John 4, the Samaritan woman at the well. Jesus spoke to a woman. Jesus spoke to a Samaritan woman around noon at Jacob's well. Any of the previous three sentences was scandalous and miraculous in and of itself, not to mention Jesus offering the woman living water.

I confess I'm not a big water drinker. I'm trying to be better with my avocado green Christmas cup, throwing in some lemon and ice, or chia seeds when I want to be extra healthy. I take it for granted that I am able to turn on the faucet and have potable water.

Park's book cover reminded me this is not everyone's reality. It's not just in the New or Old Testaments that people journeyed for water. It is very much a way of life for many to take such a trek in some developing parts of the world. Most of my years growing up in Latin America, I was never able to turn on the faucet and then drink a glass of water. It's a luxury I have come to take for granted.

Admittedly, I also take for granted that Jesus is still speaking. In unexpected places, to unexpected people, in unexpected times, Jesus still shows us with promises that he knows us, loves us, and offers us living water. And this delight in knowing that God is still speaking is an assurance of the power of Christ still at work in each of our journeys, whether we feel God at work, or if the journey seems hard and tiresome. For no matter where I am on the journey, when I'm thirsty or even when I'm not, even if it requires of me a long walk to get there, Jesus offers a well that never runs dry.

Rise Against Hunger


Dear Walnut Grove Church Family,

- 1. Name of the person who will receive the quilt.
- 2. The name of town or city (if out of North Carolina include the state name) where the person resides.
- 3. What information about the person who needs our prayers (Such as recovering from surgery, requests for prayers of healing, health issues) can be placed in the bulletin.

We may need a week or two before we can place a quilt in church to make the quilt and have it ready for the church service.

Thank you to all who request prayer quilts and say prayers and tie knots in each quilt. "We may not know why or who needs a prayer quilt, but God knows and will hear our prayers for the recipient."
