Got your attention? Perhaps you are a computer person interested in my wisdom to explain how the 1s and 0s work finally, or maybe you are an outdoorsman and need the best how-to for fish and game prep. I assure you that I am no authority on either, but I can direct you to others who are, making me a valuable resource. Well, if I offer no relief of your wondering in these fields, then what am I getting at? The idea is this. How do you process the world around you? How do you engage the ebb and flow of day-to-day without being overrun by skepticism and critique? I aim to give you a method.

I am currently enrolled in a Critical Thinking class at New Orleans, and the design is to press us to reason, considering all the angles before drawing a conclusion. We are assigned a daily reading of Jim Dennison's The Daily Article. In this report, the author seeks to bring a biblical worldview into today's issues. For the most part, I think he does a good job. Perhaps you would like to subscribe as well, but I'll leave that up to you. One article last week, ripped right for the headlines, addressed the arrest of a Texas-based Youth Pastor as one among 28 involved in a prostitution ring. No names were given, and I must confess I had not heard of this tragedy. Dennison's first response, by his admission, was to be angry that the news media sought to headline the pastor rather than the doctor or the lawyer who was arrested. How do you feel about it?

This is mine and Dennison's point because we are of the faith that the media has just taken advantage of an opportunity to blast Christianity with the water hose of judgment. How dare they single out a pastor and neglect the guilt of the other professionals. This is the danger for each one of us as we are faced with conflict, challenge, and even exposure when we are in the wrong. Because we are prideful, it is a means of defense to point out someone else's prejudice to the disregard of our own. We take up arms because one of ours is under attack. But should he not be? If he is guilty, which I would assume they are pretty confident in since they normally don't make arrest on a whim in situations such as these, should he not be headlined? After all, the Scripture is clear that those who desire to teach desire a noble task. However, it also warns that they will be held accountable dually. While it does hurt that a proclaiming Christian could allow himself to be dragged so far down, it equally hurts to know that those who had come to him for shepherding, one of those qualities being protection, have been neglected in that role. And even worse he is called to be a representative of God as all Christians are. The news outlet sought to bring a shock factor to sell their product. It worked. We also should be equally shocked, that someone of faith could participate in such heinous activity. We should be concerned that the image of God has taken another hit (as Paul warned against). We also should be aware that as Christians we too are representative of God. We would do well to shift our arousal from how dare they to how dare he. It is all about perspective.

As we move into February, we continue to pray for all who suffered loss during the storms that swept through our community and State in January. It has been encouraging to see how so many joined together to help those who have been affected. Sister churches calling to see if supplies were available or to offer supplies. Individuals gather to help cut trees and whatever else was needed along with first responders.

We see new faces in our gatherings, and make new acquaintances in the aftermath of tragedies and storms. And then as
 things settle back down, we all get wrapped back up in our own circumstances and lives. And that is what matters most to us
 again. We as a body of believers should be showing the love and compassion of Christ everyday, not just after the tragedies and storms, not just in times of need.

So as this year unfolds, I am still hopeful that,

This will be the year we put others first,

The year we pray for others without ceasing,

The year we spend more time in God's Word,

The year we spread God's Word,

The year the light of Jesus shines brightly through us, in an ever growing darker world.

May this encourage us all to love others everyday, not just in bad times.
