

Tough Love?

"Sometimes you gotta give a little 'tough love,'": a phrase often given to parents when they are asked how to regain control over disobedient and belligerent children. The Bible passages most often quoted for support are Proverbs 13:24, "Whoever spares the rod hates his son, but

he who loves him is diligent to discipline him," and 29:15, "The rod and reproof give wisdom, but a child left to himself brings shame to his mother" (ESV). However, I'm not going to discredit this notion of "tough love" in terms of scolding and removal of privileges (although corporal punishment is a topic for another day). Instead, I want us to look at the idea of that phrase, "tough love." Tough love is a redundant phrase.

Our concept of love has become soft. We think love means approving everything. When some of us hear someone say, "God is love," we are quick to say He is also Holy and Just and Righteous: fearful that our God might seem weak or passive. Instead, what if describing God as loving is how we can best describe God's strength and power?

We see God disciplines the ones He loves. This is most abundantly clear in Hebrews 12, where the term discipline is mentioned a whopping nine times in seven verses. Look specifically at verses 6-7: "'For the Lord disciplines the one he loves, and chastises every son whom he receives.' It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons. For what son is there whom his father does not discipline?" (ESV). Love is connected with discipline, and God specifically disciplines the one He loves. Just as a father disciplines his son, God is treating us as his children by disciplining us. You don't go down the street, find a random kid, and start berating her, do you? And while kids may not see this right away, one of the reasons why a mom will yet at her kid after he/she does something stupid and dangerous isn't because she just likes to yell, but because she is terrified at the notion that he/she could be seriously hurt if performed again. Discipline is what keeps us from doing dangerous things, and is a sign the person cares. I love how scholar Richard Phillips says to a man, "It is for love that God hates your sin!" (Genesis, Vol. 1, 224). What is more loving if you started to spiral down a dark path of drugs and promiscuity and poor decisions: a parent who says, "I'm going to support you whatever you decide to do, I don't want to restrict what you want to do," or a parent who says, "what you're doing is wrong and I'm going to restrict your access to these things which are harming you, and I want you to clearly understand the dangers so you don't make these harmful decisions again"? Think about how this applies to approaching our world as a whole.

This is not to say that you can just start berating people and say it's all in the name of discipline and instruction. While Ephesians 6:1 tells children to obey their parents, three verses later we read, "Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord" (ESV). Notice the contrast between discipline and provoking your children to anger? Discipline should not be torture or inhumane. Discipline means discipling, not torturing. Torture is not love.

Case in point: the Hebrew word that translates to discipline can also mean instruction and correction. Instruction and correction keeps us from making poor mistakes and hurting ourselves physically or spiritually. This reminds us of 2 Timothy 3:16 regarding the purpose of Scripture: teaching, reproof, correction, and training in righteousness. Denial of God's discipline means a denial of God's love, because God's love involves discipline. In Zephaniah 3:1-2,

Woe to her who is rebellious and defiled, the oppressing city!

2 She listens to no voice; she accepts no correction.

She does not trust in the Lord;

we hear the wail

she does not draw near to her God.

A failure to accept God's correction is a failure to trust in
Him. It's a failure to want to be close with Him.

Read Deuteronomy 11:1-12, Psalm 94, and Revelation 3:1422 and don't just read the verses that say "discipline" but

22 and don't just read the verses that say "discipline," but notice the context: the verses before and after. See how discipline is closely associated to God showing love, protection, and care to His people.

Finally, know God's love through discipline is not a punishment for sin. Jesus Christ bore our punishment for our sins. God does not display His love for us exclusively through discipline, but also through blessings, spiritual gifts, and awareness of His presence. The love of Christ does more than fill us with knowledge and understanding, but also a reciprocating love which enjoys to glorify God and enjoy Him

It's a joy to know God loves us and desires for us to do better. It's a joy to know we love because He first loved us, and while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Find joy in knowing that this same Jesus who loved us enough to die for us, also loves us enough to correct our behavior, refine our actions and understanding, and instruct us in how to teach others. That's not tough love, that's just love.


