

Copperheads

Joyce Kilmer—Trees— 1886 – 1918

I think that I shall never see A poem lovely as a tree.

A tree whose hungry mouth is prest
Against the earth's sweet flowing breast;

A tree that looks at God all day, And lifts her leafy arms to pray;

A tree that may in summer wear A nest of robins in her hair;

Upon whose bosom snow has lain; Who intimately lives with rain.

Poems are made by fools like me, But only God can make a tree.

Trees are amazing. They stand up to wind, rain, snow and ice, and when they let go their leaves it's a big deal—a sign of dramatic changes on the horizon. Remember the October Storm, October 12 to 13, 2006, over 24 inches of heavy, wet snow causing power outages for 400,000 residents. The storm resulted in 13 fatalities and approximately \$530 million in damages, making it one of the most severe early-season snowstorms in history.


Then there was Snowvember, the snowstorm of Nov. 17-20, **2014**, that left us digging out from 7 feet of snow. I wouldn't have believed it if I hadn't seen it. Remember the damage to the trees due to the combined wait of leaves and heavy wet snow? It is truly wonderful to think how God has equipped trees to shed

their leaves and move moisture around internally through a complex combination of pliable membranes, natural antifreeze, and glasslike supercooling with frost on the outside and viscous dehydration on the inside, equipping trees to avoid freezing injury to living cells. Only God can make a tree; only God can keep a tree.

Remember when you were a kid, raking up the leaves into soft, cushy dry piles to jump in? Maybe you've known the joy of sharing this experience with children and grandchildren. When Lisa and I were living in Tennessee and the boys were small, naturally we were excited to rake up the leaves and jump into them with the boys, until one day a concerned neighbor caught us and asked what we thought we were doing: "Don't you know that's where the copperheads like to hide?" Copperheads? You mean snakes? Yeah. Yikes! We felt so dumb.

Once when the boys were motoring around on the floor like little ones do, I happened to see a big hairy spider with muscles (it had muscles I tell you) jump out of the carpet, through the air, silhouetted in sunlight, enhancing every detail as this frightening Olympic arachnid flashed 6 feet through the air with such precision as to nail a fly and take it down with him. This still makes my skin crawl and my body shudder. There are some things I don't miss about the sunny south. For all the snowstorms the north has its advantages. I've heard it said, "the cold keeps out the riff raff." It sure keeps out the copper heads, and the big hairy muscular spiders. Give me snow over poisonous snakes and spiders any day. And, save me from myself! The Lord watches over the simple; I was brought low, and He saved me (Psalm 116:6).






Wednesday Family Night 2025: Awana @ LPC!

Overall Theme for the Year: Church Health and Vision Ministry Matters: What Jesus Values in His Church (9 weeks)

Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Collection

It is time to start packing shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child. The collection dates this year are November 17-24. If you bring your boxes to our church, we will be taking them to Eastern Hills Wesleyan, which is the next stop on their journey, on **Sunday November 23**.

Here are some suggestions for things to include in your boxes:

- **School supplies:** Crayons, colored pencils, markers (Preferably Crayola brand items), pencil sharpeners, erasers, rulers, glue sticks, pens and pencils with no business/church advertising logos, small pads of papers/notebooks, small calculators, drawstring backpacks
- Other suggested items: Flip Flops, Personal Hygiene items-Toothbrush, Plastic dish and bar of soap, washcloth, Jump ropes--the longer the better, Deflated soccer ball and pump, A sturdy bowl or cup and a spoon or spork, A plain colored T-shirt, socks, stuffed animals
- **For older children:** Gardening/work gloves, Sewing Kit, Flashlight-Solar or LED--send extra batteries with the ends taped over
- A few items that should <u>NOT</u> be included: Soap, Toothpaste, Candy and gum (both are no longer allowed and will be removed), Anything that requires an explanation--don't send games or crafts with English directions, Anything that is not brand new, War Toys, Anything liquid, including bottles of glue, anything glass that could break

If you decide to wrap your box after it has been packed, the top and bottom must be wrapped individually. Every shoe box is looked through at the collection center in North Carolina. The shoe box recipients receive a gospel booklet presented in their own language. Shoe box recipients also receive an invitation to attend a 12 lesson follow-up discipleship program called the Greatest Journey. The cost of **processing each box is \$10.00**. You may include a check for this amount in your shoebox or you may donate this on-line at Samaritanspurse.org and receive a shipping label that you can tape on your box. If you donate on-line, it will also track your box and you can go on-line to Operation Christmas Child, Pack a shoebox, and Label Options. You should be able to see what country your box or boxes went to.

There will be a table set up by the lounge area under the sanctuary where there will be plenty of empty boxes. Help yourself!! Plastic shoe boxes work great as well!! You can also purchase boxes from Samaritan's purse directly if you like. They have 2 kinds--plastic or cardboard. **The website is: Samaritanspurse.org.** If you have any questions, please feel free to call Pat Gerber at (716)668-2670. Have fun beginning to think about packing your shoe boxes and be in prayer that just the right boy or girl will receive your box or boxes!! I would also ask that if you packed 1 box last year you might consider doing 2 boxes this year. Every box counts and there are lots of children around the world who may only receive this simple shoe box as a gift at Christmas!!
