

# Marriage

Pastor Will and Cassandra's wedding was beautiful. I loved watching the beaming smile on Will's face as Cassandra came into view. Then, too, it was a sweet surprise when after walking Cassandra down the aisle and joining Cassandra and Will's hands together, and giving Cassandra a kiss, Cassandra's father, Jason, stepped to the side, quickly threw his robe on, then stepped into the fore-

front to fulfill his role as officiant.

I love a good wedding, when there is substance to the exchange of vows and rings, and the couple undertakes their commitments with conviction. Will and Cassandra made it crystal clear that rock solid commitment is at the foundation of their relationship. Doesn't that just do your heart good?

It puts me in mind of a teaching that I am especially excited about and wanted to share with you. It's a two session teaching on The Song of Songs or The Song of Solomon by Dr. Miles Van Pelt that you can find at the following address: <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=C9clStVlSgM">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=C9clStVlSgM</a> I am afraid that the volume of the recording is very low, but the content is amazing. I have never heard anyone explain the Song of Solomon the way that Dr. Van Pelt does, and he just really makes sense of the whole book.

One citation affirming the value of the Song from Rabbi Akiva (50-135 A.D.) surprised and grabbed me. He wrote: "All of the ages are not worth the day on which the Song of Songs was written to Israel. For all of the writings are holy, but the Song of Songs is the holy of holies." In the same high evaluation of the Song of Songs, Dr. Van Pelt highlights the significance of the name "Song of Songs", noting how this particular formulation shares affinity with similar expressions like "King of Kings" and "Lord of Lords". The repetition elevating the title to the superlative. The best song. The highest song. The song than which no song can get any better. That is really saying something when you recall that Solomon spoke 3,000 proverbs and wrote over 1,000 songs. (1 Kings 4:32)

What is the ground for this esteem? Dr. Van Pelt explains that as the Bible begins in Genesis with the great gifts of the woman ("very good") and marriage in the

time of creation, and as the mystery of the union of one husband and one wife is wonderfully analogous to the relationship between the bride groom (Jesus) and His bride (the church), and as the great fulfillment to which all is moving in the consummation at the end of all things is the marriage of the Lamb in Revelation 19 through the end of Revelation, then God's gift of marriage to the whole human family is inestimably valuable and the Song of Songs is the highest expression of that priceless gift in all of Scripture.

Doctor Van Pelt's classification of the Song as a poetic wisdom song written to teach young women how to think about marriage makes sense. Biblical wisdom literature teaches God's people how to live in God's world according to God's truth revealed to us in creation and Scripture. The Song teaches young women (and young men) the importance of a good spouse or as my grandfather used to say, "marry in haste repent at your leisure." The song is written by Solomon from the perspective of a wise woman. In the Song a young woman is presented with two options: Genesis 2 love or the luxury and security of Solomon's harem— 700 wives, 300 concubines, and virgins without number. There are two men in the Song: the beloved Shepherd in 2:8 through 3:5, and Solomon with his warrior eunuchs in 3:6-8:4. The whole point of the Song is found in 8:5-14. The woman is teaching us. She is the hero of the story. She resists the temptation of the bride price, a life of luxury, wealth, servants, delicacies, security in the palace of Solomon, with jewelry, fine clothes, skin care, hair care, and makeup. She turns her back on all of it for the ideal of an exclusive one flesh marriage commitment with her beloved shepherd. She chooses wisely and clings to God's design for marriage grounded in rock solid commitment and white hot intimacy:

Song of Solomon 8:6-7

<sup>6</sup> "Put me like a seal over your heart, Like a seal on your arm. For love is as strong as death, Jealousy is as severe as Sheol; Its flashes are flashes of fire, The very flame of the Lord. <sup>7</sup> "Many waters cannot quench love, Nor will rivers overflow it; If a man were to give all the riches of his house for love, It would be utterly despised." Beloved, let marriage be held in honor by all, and those whom God has joined together, let no one separate. I love you, dear ones! Pastor Kelly

# **Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Collection**

It is time to begin thinking about packing shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child. The collection dates this year are November 17-24. If you bring your boxes to our church, we will be taking them to Eastern Hills Wesleyan, which is the next stop on their journey, on **Sunday November 23**. Summer is a great time to start purchasing your school supplies because they are all on sale. It is also a great time to start thinking about what you would like to put in your boxes.

# Here are some suggestions for things to include in your boxes:

### School supplies

Crayons, colored pencils, markers (Preferably Crayola brand items), pencil sharpeners, erasers, rulers, glue sticks, pens and pencils with no business/church advertising logos, small pads of papers/notebooks, small calculators, drawstring backpacks

### Other suggested items:

Flip Flops, Personal Hygiene items-Toothbrush, Plastic dish and bar of soap, washcloth, Jump ropes--the longer the better, Deflated soccer ball and pump, A sturdy bowl or cup and a spoon or spork, A plain colored T-shirt, socks, stuffed animals

### For older children:

Gardening/work gloves, Sewing Kit, Flashlight-Solar or LED--send extra batteries with the ends taped over

### A few items that should NOT be included:

Soap, Toothpaste, Candy and gum (both are no longer allowed and will be removed), Anything that requires an explanation--don't send games or crafts with English directions, Anything that is not brand new, War Toys, Anything liquid, including **bottles of glue**, anything glass that could break

If you decide to wrap your box after it has been packed, the top and bottom must be wrapped individually. Every shoe box is looked through at the collection center in North Carolina. The shoe box recipients receive a gospel booklet presented in their own language. Shoe box recipients also receive an invitation to attend a 12 lesson follow-up discipleship program called the Greatest Journey. The cost of **processing each box is \$10.00**. You may include a check for this amount in your shoebox or you may donate this on-line at Samaritanspurse.org and receive a shipping label that you can tape on your box. If you donate on-line, it will also track your box and you can go on-line to Operation Christmas Child, Pack a shoebox, and Label Options. You should be able to see what country your box or boxes went to.

There will be a table set up by the lounge area under the sanctuary where there will be plenty of empty boxes. Help yourself!! Plastic shoe boxes work great as well!! You can also purchase boxes from Samaritan's purse directly if you like. They have 2 kinds--plastic or cardboard. **The website is: Samaritanspurse.org.** If you have any questions, please feel free to call Pat Gerber at (716)668-2670. Have fun beginning to think about packing your shoe boxes and be in prayer that just the right boy or girl will receive your box or boxes!! I would also ask that if you packed 1 box last year you might consider doing 2 boxes this year. Every box counts and there are lots of children around the world who may only receive this simple shoe box as a gift at Christmas!!

# **Final Report Walk for Life 2025**

### Overall

- The Walk For Life raised enough to support 75% (1225 women) of their goal of serving 1640 women and their babies with ethical medical care for one year and an opportunity to hear the gospel message
- There were around 130 hosted walks nationally
- Buffalo had 32 unique walks.
- An estimated 6,000 prolife Christians nationally expressed their prolife convictions by walking.

### LPC

- Raised enough to provide support for over 18 women and babies
- Had 58 walkers with 6 churches represented
- Walk went directly in and through the heart of our local Lancaster village
- Local police and our own safety team did an excellent job, there were zero problems

### CompassCare Buffalo: 2025 so far

- 59 preborn boys and girls saved
- 23 women received Christ!

### Our Freezers are Restocked!!!

We are guessing you heard about how we had lost over 10,000 lbs. of food due to two of our freezers malfunctioning. The estimated total loss was valued at \$25,000. Within three weeks of this happening we have already gained back our losses! At this date we have raised over \$45,000 in donations. We also received over 1,500 lbs. of frozen meat and 2,000 lbs of other frozen goods. Praise God for everyone's generosity in our community that helped us recover! We are beyond amazed at how our tragedy turned out for good, not only did we make a full recovery, we also never missed serving a meal to those in need, and this issue actually helped us continue to raise awareness through the various news reports that were published. The Lord has been so good to us!
