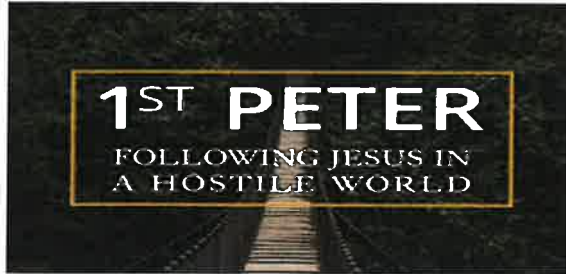

2021 Fall Mission Conference Friday, Nov. 5th to Sunday, Nov. 7th

For the past several years, LPC has set apart the first weekend in November to allow the congregation to gain a better understanding of what God is doing around the world and in our community through the work of specific missionaries and ministries that our congregation supports. After the "pause" in 2020, we are very blessed to be able to celebrate it again this year.

Keynote Speaker Reverend Emery Brown will lead a series of messages during the weekend that will help us stay focused on the overall topic of God at work throughout the whole world.

This year's theme: God's Work and Our Work in the Harvest (Matthew 9: 36-38)

- The congregation will also be able to browse through display tables and converse with the missionaries.
- There will also be refreshing times of worship through music and prayer.
- There will be a reception with refreshments on Friday evening to kick things off at 7pm, followed by a worship service.
- Enjoy a continental breakfast on Saturday morning right before the morning sessions at 9am.
- Our traditional harvest dinner will be served on Saturday evening at 6pm. The entire congregation is invited to attend this meal. **Please use the signup sheets on the Information Table.** Following the dinner will be a worship service.
- We will close the weekend with our traditional soup lunch after the Sunday service at 12:30pm (It's been a long time since we had one too!) Everyone is welcome!
- This year we will have Paul & Reinhild Sydnor, who work among refugees in Europe. Paul is the European leader for the International Association for Refugees, Nick and Kim (formerly Gabby) Balsamo, who serves with United World Mission and has been a missionary in India, Urban Christian Ministries, PATH and ISI among others.
- Technology will help us connect with missionaries on the field who cannot be present this year.
