I'm doing something that I've never done before. I'm writing this on the morning of July 20th, sharing what has been happening, in full faith that as this News is completed at the end of this week, there will be miracles to share. I'm sitting to write this, which would have been nearly impossible for the majority of the past month. Visiting the ER the beginning of June revealed a severely compressed nerve in my low back. The pains were horrible. Two ER visits now, and only temporary medications from them, but because of God's faithfulness, I can sit and walk for brief times. Last week's group from Oregon sounds amazing. I never got to meet them. Our team did a wonderful job working alongside them, serving them and sharing this ministry with them. I already knew they didn't really need me, but hearing the stories was such a blessing. Tonight, a group of 18 arrives led by an organization from Texas who coordinated the trip for a team from Maryland. That's a big group for our team. It's also the week we distribute backpacks, AND monsoon rains have begun. In addition to my physical condition, Dale's pains have worsened, but he'll not only be overseeing the construction tasks, but also driving the RV for backpack distribution. As mentioned, I've never done this before, but wanted to share my perspective this morning. God has never let us down. We are confident He won't start now.

Today is Friday...five days after the above was written. Am I healed? Not yet, but I know the One who knows all of me, and His plans are perfect. Dale was able to take me on the 2-hour drive to a GOOD doctor who gave us a plan...the shots I need can be given right here in Globe. The large team of short-term missionaries were wonderful! I got to lead one of the two prayer journeys. The original plan was for me to lead two, back-to-back. Vermaleen offered to take that second one. Dale and I were supposed to be their hosts. Jon and Linda added all of that to their very busy week, and, evidently, got to play some games with the group in the evenings. Pros and former team member Lynell faithfully helped with backpack distribution all week. A doctor appointment became available in the valley, giving some reassuring answers. While we were at the doctor, Macaiah supervised the construction sites, and Roxie drove the RV for backpack distribution.

The lists of things our team did for us is long...and deeply appreciated. Were there miracles? Vincent's first great-grand daughter was born this week and had to be airlifted to a hospital in Phoenix. After being examined by a doctor there, she's healthy and back at home on the Reservation. My brother, who suffered a devastating fall earlier this month, continues to improve. By God's grace, his personality is intact, and yesterday he enjoyed pancakes for his first meal. It rained. A LOT. But...never at the work site or where backpacks were being distributed!

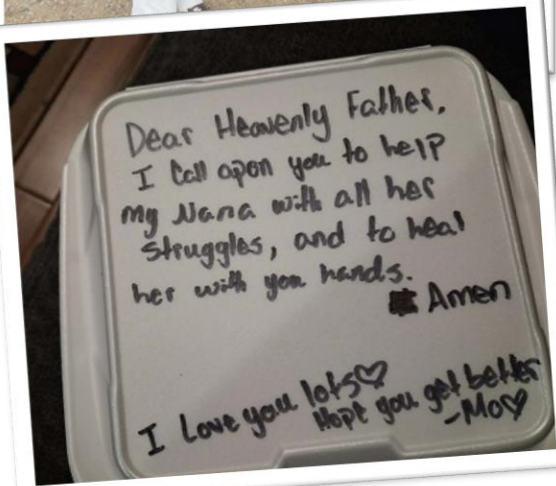
I tried asking God for a specific time for our great-grandson to make his appearance. He's not here yet. It was also a great reminder that GOD's plans are perfect. Trusting may not always be easy, but God will never let us down.



We're SO thankful to those who provided for our annual Backpack Project. While the Tribal Districts also distribute backpacks, many families have limited transportation or were unable to attend because of the rain on distribution days. Thanks to your generosity, we were able to help ensure those children also started the school year with the supplies they needed. After all, there's well over 5,000 students on the San Carlos Apache Reservation! The BHHS Legacy Foundation in Phoenix has been generously providing backpacks for us as well. This year, just after schools have resumed, Pros will be picking up 300 backpacks from them to deliver to the schools. As with everything within this ministry (and our family!), we continue to be humbled by God's gracious provision and guidance. Thanks to those who generously give, and who gave for this practical provision! Our distribution now transitions to providing for the churches and schools of San Carlos. The stories are many. We will be sharing some as this unfolds in our ARM August Quarterly News.



Pros and Roxie are picking up students for basketball practice and Bible lessons several mornings each week. The kids and teens attending are many-and eager to learn, not only basketball skills, BUT lessons from Scripture as well! Vincent and Vermaleen have been tasked as the leaders to take other Apaches to Southeast Asia for a mission trip in December 2026! Meetings are underway and other necessary preparations are unfolding. If interested in helping either of these Native couples with the fruit-bearing tasks God has called them to, simply note that within your donation so that we can apply it as designated. Macaiah has become a recognized preacher on the Reservation. He's also gathering other men to grow in their faith as well as the God-given responsibilities many men need to remember.



As mentioned, we are thankful for the two teams serving alongside us this past month! There's a new team arriving in August to not only serve in construction and with our children's ministries (and pray through the reservation, etc.) but to also determine if an on-going partnership with them is feasible. As this ministry continues to serve Jesus Christ, the tasks HE orchestrates, the team members HE provides is only possible because of the partners HE also prompts. To those of you who pray for us, send notes of encouragement, send in practical provisions like food, diapers, school supplies or financial support, please know that each of us thanks you, and thanks God for you.

Jon, Linda and Morgan have delivered meals to Dale and me as the visiting teams have gathered in the evenings. Morgan's message/prayer written on the lid of the "take-out" container (above) was such a blessing to this Nana and Poppy. Andi has spent time at Grand Canyon University "camps" as she prepares to move there in September. Edward and Tyler are both working out in preparation for playing on their high school football teams. We thoroughly enjoyed the few games we got to watch as 7-year-old Tommy played flag football and hearing of Ronin and Nolan's progress and successes as flag football players in Show Low. Justin is in Oregon fighting wildfires up there with his team from Maricopa. Jenna is now taking lessons from sister, Jacque about raising chickens and quail. Their chicken coop is pink. Really pink! It's lovingly being referred to as Jenna's Poultry Palace. In spite of pains and health issues (please pray for Jenna as she gets to see a doctor in August), we are incredibly grateful. Each of our children love the Lord and are on paths to Him. Thank you so very much for your prayers!
