“The Quiet Force of our Character” (Prov 25) – 2/8/26

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### Sermon Overview

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#### Main Idea

Proverbs 25 shows us how even subtle aspects of our character powerfully shape our lives.

1. Humility for leaders (v.1-7a)
2. Wisdom with words (v.7b – 15)
3. Peace in relationships (v.16-28)

### Discussion Questions

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#### Initial Engagement

- What is the main idea of the text, or what did the sermon focus on?
- What insight from the text or sermon stood out to you most, and why?

#### Deeper Reflection

- Proverbs reminds us that the good news of the gospel is not just for salvation but also for character transformation. How is the Lord currently working to transform you?
- In what ways is our character transformation similar to the plot of *Ford v. Ferrari*? In other words, how was the Ford GT40 made able to compete with the Ferraris? How does that mirror the Christian life?
- Explain the wisdom in being circumspect, not rushing to spread information before we can see the bigger picture.
- How does v.15 give wisdom for making persuasive arguments? How does this contrast foolish attempts to persuade?
- How do verses 21-22 challenge our desire for revenge on our enemies?
- Share a way you have capitulated (or been tempted to capitulate) in a conversation or relationship. How can you grow in this?

- What is one thing you want to remember or one way you hope to change in light of this sermon or discussion?
