# **Discussion Questions**

### Initial Engagement

- What is the main idea of the text, or what did the sermon focus on?
- What insight from the text or sermon stood out to you most, and why?

### **Deeper Reflection**

- When you hear the word "refuge," what do you think of? What image comes to your mind, and how have you leaned on the Lord in times of trouble?
- In v.1, what is meant by the Hebrew word "to dwell?" How was this word compared to the use of an Airbnb?
- How does the change in pronouns in verses 3-13 (from first person I/my to you/your) alter the feel of the passage?
- How do we understand God to be the protector of his people while we still face trouble in this world? Is God's protection from trouble a condition of our obedience to him?
- Who is speaking in verses 14-16? How have you taken comfort from these words?

• What is one thing you want to remember or one way you hope to change in light of this sermon or discussion?
