The annual congregational meeting for the review of the 2021-2022 program reports and the election of officers will be on Sunday, June 19, immediately following the worship service.



# A Message from stewardship

## How Your Pledge Can Help the Church – AND YOU!!



### Did you know...

- ~ If you are required to take an annual distribution from your IRA, you can make a "Qualified Charitable Distribution" (QCD) by having funds directly transferred from your IRA to the church. This will count toward satisfying your required minimum distribution for the year (up to \$100,000) but is excluded from your taxable income. What an advantage! (Note: This advantage does not apply to Roth IRAs, which are already tax-exempt.)
- ~ Maybe you are too young to be taking distributions from an IRA. However, if you possess stocks that are currently worth significantly more than they were at the time you got them, you can also benefit by transferring shares equal to your pledge. Doing so allows you to avoid paying capital gains on the appreciated value. (If the church sells the stock, it does not have to pay capital gains.)

## Investment Committee Members Sought

First Pres has been blessed with successful investments. Over the last several years, these investments have been increased by stock shares being transferred to the church as pledge payments.

In addition, there are money market accounts and savings accounts.

Because we are called to be good stewards of our resources, it has become evident that an oversight committee is needed. This committee would meet twice a year to review and evaluate the church's investment and savings accounts. If any changes are deemed advisable, the committee would recommend them to Session.



If you believe your knowledge or expertise would be of value on this committee, please let Leslie Clark know. The first meeting is anticipated for early June.

What is even better than produce from a farmer’s market? That which you grow in your backyard.

Raised garden bed kits offer a simple and fast way to begin gardening with a small amount of effort. Using a kit requires no special tools or advanced skills to assemble the container. They are easy to install following the manufacturer’s instructions.

Raised garden bed plans and kits come in different styles and sizes. These are great for growing herbs and your own ingredients for salsa or salad. Once you’ve mastered the gardening technique, you can make a raised garden bed to plant crowds of seasonal flowers to add color to your landscape.

Kits are available in a range of sizes and materials. Most types of garden beds are the open-bottom variety that are placed directly on the ground. Some elevated raised garden beds are assembled on legs. These are great for small patios or decks and require even less bending or squatting to tend to the plants.


### Boscov's Fundraiser Results


