## **Scripture Verses for Today's Service**

First Scripture Lesson: Ezekiel 2:1-10 (NRSV)

The Vision of the Scroll

<sup>1</sup> He said to me: "O mortal, stand up on your feet, and I will speak with you." <sup>2</sup> And when he spoke to me, a spirit entered into me and set me on my feet, and I heard him speaking to me. <sup>3</sup> He said to me, "Mortal, I am sending you to the people of Israel, to a nation of rebels who have rebelled against me; they and their ancestors have transgressed against me to this very day. <sup>4</sup> The descendants are impudent and stubborn. I am sending you to them, and you shall say to them, 'Thus says the Lord God.' <sup>5</sup> Whether they hear or refuse to hear (for they are a rebellious house), they shall know that there has been a prophet among them. <sup>6</sup> And you, O mortal, do not be afraid of them, and do not be afraid of their words, though briers and thorns surround you and you live among scorpions; do not be afraid of their words, and do not be dismayed at their looks, for they are a rebellious house. <sup>7</sup> You shall speak my words to them, whether they hear or refuse to hear, for they are a rebellious house.

<sup>8</sup> "But you, mortal, hear what I say to you; do not be rebellious like that rebellious house; open your mouth and eat what I give you." <sup>9</sup> I looked, and a hand was stretched out to me, and a written scroll was in it. <sup>10</sup> He spread it before me; it had writing on the front and on the back, and written on it were words of lamentation and mourning and woe.

#### **Second Scripture Lesson: Ezekiel 3:1-15 (NRSV)**

<sup>1</sup> He said to me, "O mortal, eat what is offered to you; eat this scroll, and go, speak to the house of Israel." <sup>2</sup> So I opened my mouth, and he gave me the scroll to eat. <sup>3</sup> He said to me, "Mortal, eat this scroll that I give you and fill your stomach with it." Then I ate it, and in my mouth it was as sweet as honey.

<sup>4</sup> He said to me, "Mortal, go to the house of Israel and speak my very words to them. <sup>5</sup> For you are not sent to a people of obscure speech and difficult language but to the house of Israel, <sup>6</sup> not to many peoples of obscure speech and difficult language whose words you cannot understand. Surely, if I sent you to them, they would listen to you. <sup>7</sup> But the house of Israel will not be willing to listen to you, for they are not willing to listen to me, because all the house of Israel have a hard forehead and a stubborn heart. <sup>8</sup> See, I have made your face hard against their faces and your forehead hard against their foreheads. <sup>9</sup> Like the hardest stone, harder than flint, I have made your forehead; do not fear them or be dismayed at their looks, for they are a rebellious house." <sup>10</sup> He said to me, "Mortal, all my words that I shall speak to you receive in your heart and hear with your ears; <sup>11</sup> then go to the exiles, to your people, and speak to them. Say to them, 'Thus says the Lord God,' whether they hear or refuse to hear."

#### Ezekiel at the River Chebar

<sup>12</sup> Then the spirit lifted me up, and as the glory of the Lord rose from its place, I heard behind me the sound of loud rumbling; <sup>13</sup> it was the sound of the wings of the living creatures brushing against one another and the sound of the wheels beside them that sounded like a loud rumbling. <sup>14</sup> The spirit lifted me up and bore me away; I went in bitterness in the heat of my spirit, the hand of the Lord being strong upon me. <sup>15</sup> I came to the exiles at Tel-abib, who lived by the River Chebar. And I sat there among them, stunned, for seven days.



The opening four lines of this hymn celebrate attributes of Christ that are revealed through holy Scripture, which serves as a lantern, a chart, and a compass for the church in seeking to know Christ better. The setting of the tune comes from Felix Mendelssohn's Elijah.

# Thy Word Is a Lamp unto My Feet 458



The refrain of this 20th-century song is a quotation of Psalm 119:105 in the King James Version. That longest of all psalms celebrates the gift of God's law by accumulating many synonyms for it. In Christian practice, this verse has been used to give thanks for all Scripture.

#### The Gift of Love



As paraphrases of 1 Corinthians 13:1, 3 the first two stanzas here are in the first person singular, yet they lead into a plural prayer for the gift of such love, for it thrives in community. These words are especially poignant with this adaptation of an English folk melody.
