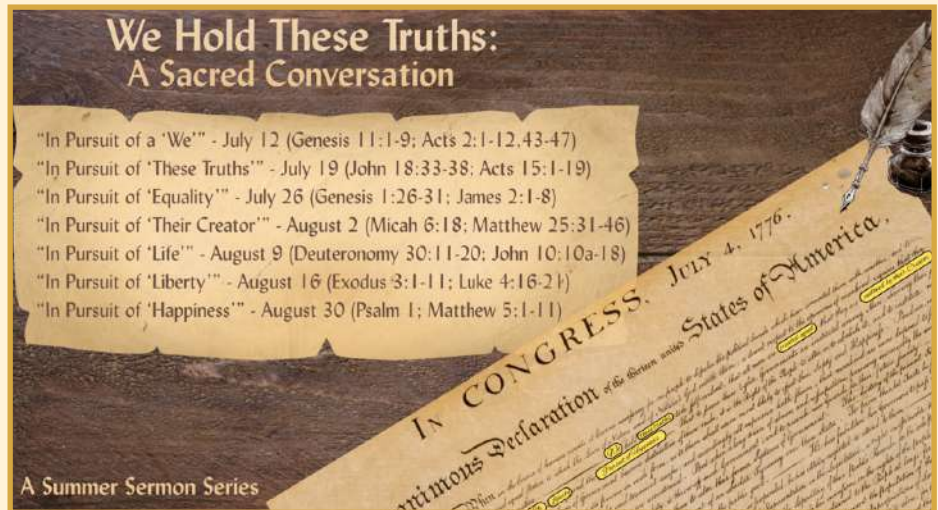

## Summer Sermon Series 2026

This year, 2026, marks the 250th anniversary of the United States & the 125th anniversary of FPCHH. The Summer Sermon Series will place the values proclaimed in the Declaration of Independence in conversation with Scripture. How do we pursue “we,” “truth,” “equality,” “our creator,” “life,” “liberty,” and “happiness” today?



### **July 12:** "In Pursuit of a *We*"

(*Genesis 11:1-9; Acts 2:1-12, 43-47*)

- \*What does it mean to be a "We" instead of an "I"?
- \*Who was included in the "We" of 1776? Who is included today?
- \*How expansive is God's definition of "We"?

### **July 19:** "In Pursuit of *These Truths*"

(*John 18:33-38; Acts 15:1-19*)

- \*Truth is wrestled with, lived into, and discovered.
- \*Truth in scripture is complex. Is the same true in America today?

### **July 26:** "In Pursuit of *Equality*"

(*Genesis 1:26-31; James 2:1-8*)

- \*We were created equal – do we still honor that creation?
- \*What is the Bible's, the church's, and America's struggle with equality?
- \*Equality as a sacred truth is an ongoing pursuit.

### **August 2:** "In Pursuit of *Their Creator*"

(*Micah 6:1-8; Matthew 25:31-46*)

- \*What does it mean to claim that rights come from God?
- \*What is our human responsibility to the divine gift?

### **August 9:** "In Pursuit of *Life*"

(*Deuteronomy 30:11-20; John 10:10a-18*)

- \*Choose a life of abundance, not just one of existence.
- \*Life is in community and interconnected.

### **August 16:** "In Pursuit of *Liberty*"

(*Exodus 3:1-11; Luke 4:16-21*)

- \*Liberation in the Bible is a pursuit of justice for the oppressed.

### **August 30:** "In Pursuit of *Happiness*"

(*Psalm 1; Matthew 5:1-11*)

- \*Happiness vs. blessedness;
- \*Happiness as right relationship with God;
- \*Happiness as a collective, not individually;

**Summer Worship Time**

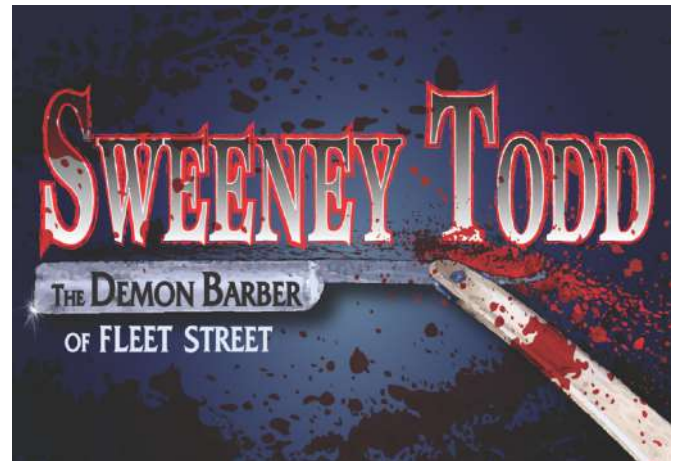
Our worship services will transition to our summer worship schedule on **Sunday, June 21, when our services will start at 9:30 AM.** This schedule will continue through September 6.


Our **2 Cents a Meal** collection on April 12, the Sunday after Easter, was \$89.00.




### Very Big Sunday June 7th


## Wednesday on Zoom adult bible study




## Adult Sunday School

## First Pres YOUTH

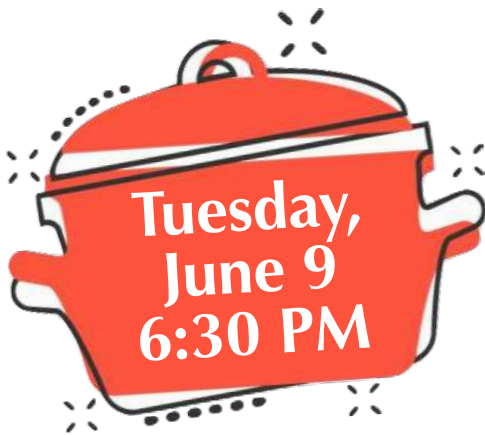

## The YES's and NO's to Recycling

We have just been certified as an Earth Care Congregation for the 10th year ... this is an achievement to celebrate! BUT (*there's always a but*), we are falling down on the job with our recycling. We all want to do our part, but sometimes we think something is recyclable when it is not. So, **please, please** be mindful of what you place in a recycling container rather than in the trash.

Here are guidelines to help you and all of us:

### **NO TO RECYCLING (*this is the part to read carefully*):**

- Paper towels, napkins, plates and paper cups
- Plastic cups, straws and utensils
- Plastic wrap of any kind (including bubble wrap) regardless of whether it has recycling labeling on it
- Plastic caps
- Any and all plastics other than #1 and #2 bottles and jars
- Frozen food containers, including ice cream containers (they are lined with plastic)
- Styrofoam
- Any type of plastic bags
- Shredded paper
- Hard cover books unless the covers are removed first
- Fed Ex / Tyvek-type plastic envelopes (made with plastic polymers)

### **YES TO RECYCLING:**

- Newspaper & mixed paper including junk mail, magazines, etc.  
(no need to remove paper clips or staples from multiple sheets of paper)
- Paperboard cartons for foods such as cereal boxes, pasta boxes and tissue boxes, etc.
- Cardboard
- Glass bottles and jars  
(empty and rinse containers fully before placing them in the recycling container)
- Aluminum and steel cans & lids
- Plastic bottles and jars with #1 or #2 found on the bottom
- Milk and juice cartons
- Paper towel and toilet paper inserts.

***Please think before you toss items into a container! Thanks for helping us take care of God's creation!***

# MISSION TEENS Testimony



My name is Parker Roberson. I am 37 years old, and for 33 years I ran from the Lord like Jonah. For no particular reason either, because I had everything I needed growing up. I was not abused, neglected, or bullied. In fact I was blessed in so many ways throughout my life. The problem was "I" - "me" - "myself". Selfish pride & stubborn unbelief took me down the road of chasing things of this world & pleasures of the flesh, & as I abused God's grace over and over he eventually let me come to the end of myself. I met this end after years of failed relationships and cycles of addiction that seemed endless. That is where Jesus met me, because I didn't find God, he found me.

Shortly thereafter he completely wrecked my "life". He showed me as plain as day it needed to be wrecked. All so he could re-make it for me. So that I could be reborn into the person he originally planned me to be. The thing about newborns is that they often stumble when they first attempt to walk. I certainly am no exception, and I am a repeater here at Mission Teens. "Repeater" is fondly synonymous with stubborn for those who are familiar with the Mission. Stubbornness can be a strength as I am too stubborn to give up on the life Christ has for me.

Through his redeeming grace I am beginning to better understand John 14:6. He is the truth, the life, and the way, and the truth is I just have to surrender mine. Once I started to do this I discovered a life that was far beyond my hopes or imagination. Like many I used to believe that a Christian life was one of lack and restriction. It is in fact the exact opposite.

This is my testimony that I was dead in my sin and lost in my own deception. In spite of these things Jesus saved me and gave me EVERYTHING. I am learning that free will is a beautiful gift from God, but also comes with great responsibility. In life everything is your choice, so choose Jesus, because He chooses you. If you find yourself miserable that is your choice. If you destroy rather than build that is your choice. If you deny yourself, pick up your cross and follow Him... well that is MY choice.
