The season of Lent is a time we usually set aside for fasting, repenting, giving things up, and recognizing the failing of our lives. The word “repent” in its simplest form means “to turn around.” So, this Lent, we are going to make a different turn. We’re going to recognize the “Good News” right in the middle of the bad.

Actually, we proclaim the “Good News of Jesus Christ” every Sunday in our Assurance of Pardon. Yet, we are a people who tend to focus on ‘bad news.’ Sometimes we’re even skeptical of too much good news, or looking on the bright side, or being glass half-full kind of people. We ask if those who constantly proclaim good news aren’t paying attention or are blissfully ignorant.

We would, of course, never say this about Jesus. And yet ... Jesus lived in a time of very bad news for his people and right in the middle of it ... he proclaimed “Good News.” He insisted that Good (and God) can and will always prevail.

The word that Jesus used for “Good News” in Greek has several meanings, including *Gospel* and *evangelize*; which means that to “believe in the Good News of the Gospel” means to share the Good News of the Good News!

What about you? Do you believe in the Good News of the Good News? Will you turn around and believe in the Good News of the Good News this Lent?

Wednesday **adult bible study**







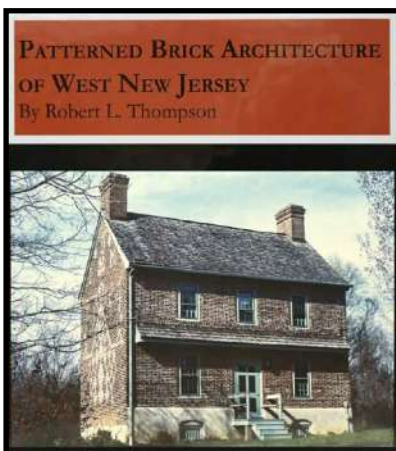
Saluting Those Who Served

Haddonfield Pres is hosting a Summer Youth Mission Trip in 2026 for students entering 9th grade through graduated seniors — including students from our church.



A special **THANK YOU** to Ruth for her dedication and hard work in coordinating this event for FPCHH for the past 10 years!

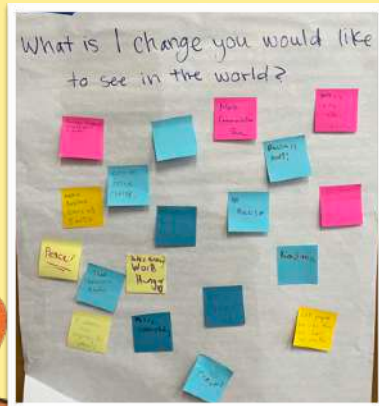
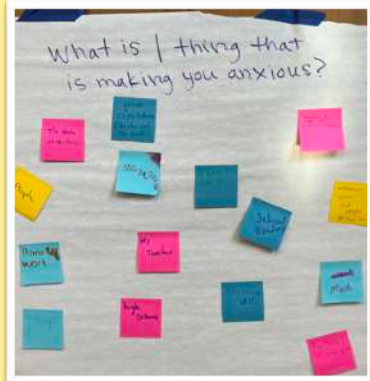
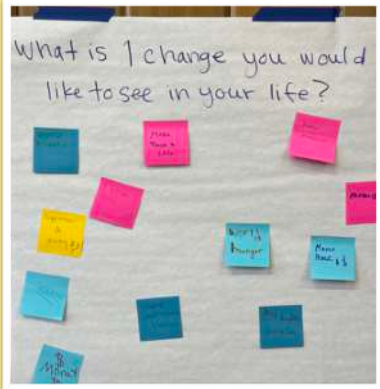

Mission Teens Update

Testimony



My name is Hannah Breitwieser, I am 18 years old. I was born in PA to a family of addicts and felons. God had mercy on me despite knowing what I would do in my future. He destined me to be adopted into a family that worshiped the Lord and accepted Jesus Christ as their ultimate Savior.

I grew up in church, active in the choir and youth programs, but nothing ever clicked. I was never thankful and never protected my walk. I allowed generational curses to take over my life. My mom and dad gave me everything I've ever asked for, it was a house full of love. But selfishly I became fixated on achieving a relationship with my birth mother. I became distracted from seeing what God had already done for me and obsessed over what He didn't.

Around 14 years old, I used fentanyl for the first time. I fell in love with the feeling of being somewhere physically, but not mentally there at all. The more I lived in addiction, the more my eyes witnessed, the darker my actions grew. I was introduced to a man 20 years older than me, and very quickly I found myself meeting new rock bottoms. I became a missing juvenile in the state of NJ. I knew what I was doing was wrong. I knew I was hurting friends and family. I was focused on one thing, getting my next fix. Crack and fentanyl became the "gods" in my life. I have seen death and I have been the death others have seen, but it wasn't until my body became immune to Narcan that I really thought about where I would go if I died.

I was beaten so badly, broken ribs, overdosed, etc. when I woke up in the hospital in Atlantic City, NJ. I had died for 4 mins, it took 4 Narcan attempts. I was in so much pain, just 2 hours later, I was back at it getting my next fix.

Something changed though, I prayed to God, "God I don't know what to do anymore, I don't want to love this man anymore, I don't want to live like this anymore, but I don't know where to start." It took a little time and multiple prayers, but He brought me to the Mission. He took away that person and gave me so much more. I am in a house full of people seeking God, who genuinely care about me. I am hungry and thirsty for Jesus to continue healing me because I know HE is real. I know what His presence feels like. I never want to give that up again and I wish I did it sooner, but this is God's plan.

Some scriptures I stand on are 2 Timothy 4:17: *"But the Lord stood at my side and gave me strength, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the Gentiles might hear it. And I was delivered from the lion's mouth";* and Genesis 50:20: *"You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives."*

Hannah is a resident at the Mission Teens center in Crossville, TN.
