




Our First Pres Youth Group holds social & service events for teens in grades 6-12 throughout the year.


#### Men's Breakfast This Fall

## How to Reduce Your Computer Energy Usage and Save Money

#### Which Consumes More Power, a PC or a Laptop?

A desktop PC consumes significantly more power than a laptop. While laptops typically use 30 to 70 watts, desktops often draw 200 to 500 watts or more, especially with powerful GPUs or multiple monitors. The higher performance and constant plug-in design make desktops much less energy-efficient overall.

Drastic changes are not needed to lower your computer's energy consumption; just a few smart habits will help. Whether you're trying to save on electricity costs or reduce your environmental impact, these tips will help you get started.

- <u>Lower Screen Brightness</u>: reducing your monitor's brightness, especially for large or high-resolution displays, can noticeably cut power usage during long sessions.
- <u>Enable Power-Saving Modes</u>: activate your computer's energy-saving settings to scale down performance when full power isn't needed, such as when browsing or document writing/editing.
- <u>Sleep or Hibernate When Idle</u>: Set your device to sleep after a short period of inactivity to avoid unnecessary energy draw when you step away.
- <u>Unplug Unused Peripherals</u>: Printers, speakers, webcams, and USB hubs continue to consume power even when idle. Disconnect them when they're not in use.



<u>Track Usage with Smart Plugs</u>: use a "smart plug" with energy monitoring to get a real-time look at how much power your workstation consumes and identify where you can cut back.

These steps are easy to implement and make a noticeable difference, especially for those who use their systems daily.



#### On Stage for Village Playbox



the way. But with too much


weight on the broom, they take a tumble and come face to face with a hungry dragon--and then real the fun begins!






