
First Pres YOUTH GROUP




Our two Sunday School classes for adults began in September along with our children's classes.




Next Collection: November 9

What IS the Friendship Circle?

Below is some information about the events that the Friendship Circle hosts and the organizations they have supported over the years.

Kiva Loans

Since 2012, the Women's Circle of First Presbyterian Church Haddon Heights has provided \$14,875 in Kiva loans to women in underserved communities throughout the world. These women are entrepreneurs who need a little help to expand or improve their businesses. The loan is usually \$200. Although that appears to be a small amount, its impact can dramatically improve the recipient's business and life. Each recipient is expected to pay back the loan over time. In 13 years of providing Kiva loans, 98% of our recipients have paid back their loans in full. The Circle currently has four outstanding loans.

Thanksgiving Tea

Members of the Friendship Circle will host the annual Thanksgiving Tea after our worship service on Sunday, November 23. Join us for this special time of fellowship!

Coming Soon!

In January, the Friendship Circle will repeat what was a popular fundraiser: laundry sheets! These sheets replace your regular liquid or powder detergent, have minimal (paper) packaging and eliminate the need for us to recycle or discard millions of plastic bottles every year. And yes, they work!

Supporting the MudGirls

On October 18 our Friendship Circle co-hosted the Presbyterian Women's Fall Gathering at the Haddonfield Presbyterian Church. Thirty women attended, coming from various churches in our Presbytery. Dorrie Papademetriou, founder of the MudGirls Studio in Atlantic City, gave an excellent presentation on the organization, which provides opportunities in art and entrepreneurship to economically disadvantaged and at-risk women by providing training in the creation of unique and beautiful ceramic pieces.

"Recycling" Your Vegetable Scraps

STOP Don't Throw Away Those Vegetable Scraps!



When you're cutting and peeling your vegetables for a healthy lunch or dinner, don't throw away those scraps (unless you have a composting bin). You can simply put them in a gallon-sized (freezer-suitable) reusable container and stick them in the freezer. Easily add to the container until it is full, and then place the contents into 8 cups of water to make your own vegetable broth! Just make sure they are clean and not spoiled.

Do's and Don't's for Your Vegetable Scraps

Here are some general guidelines to follow:

Do's

- carrot scrapings
- · celery leaves and tips
- brown onion skins
- · garlic skins
- parsley stalks
- · wilted thyme and other herbs (the herbs that sit in fridge when you only needed two teaspoons and had to buy the bunch!)
- green carrot tops
- parmesan rinds





Don't's (these items may leave your broth bitter)

- broccoli
- cauliflower
- · brussels sprouts
- cabbage
- potatoes (these are not recommended because the starch will turn your broth cloudy.)

Strain the broth through a sieve, add seasoning, and enjoy!

Plus, you have saved the earth from some trash!

Mission Teens Update

Testimony Update ...

From Pat Masi: In September, when Shelby Peel was doing well at The Lion's Den Mission Teens center in Roscommon, Michigan, we shared her testimony in the FPC newsletter. However, much of Shelby's past was hidden from people and unconfessed to God. Her deep unwillingness to "come clean" led to behavior that caused her to be transferred to our center in Crossville, Tennessee. There Shelby had a spiritual break through in which she finally accepted the deep, deep love of God in Christ. At last she told the whole truth about the depth of the abuse she endured as a child and released the guilt and shame of her subsequent behavior which held her captive for years.

I am sharing Shelby's revised testimony for two reasons: firstly, because it shows how God uses Mission Teens to work in the lives of desperate people; secondly, to encourage us all to trust this God in our own lives. We can come to God just as we are and let Him do a deep cleansing work in us which will assure us that we are loved and forgiven and part of His family with gifts to share and a life to be lived! If you are interested in another miracle story from Mission Teens, her story is below.



Shelby Peel, while a resident at the Michigan Mission Teens Center.

My name is Shelby Peel. I am 40 years old, and I was born in Flint, Michigan. I grew up in Grand Blanc, MI with my mom, stepdad and younger brother. My biological dad never had custody of me because he went to prison for selling cocaine when I was little. When he got out, I was told he refused to take any drug

tests to be able to see me. I didn't know him well and he passed away when I was 15. I was molested from the age of 3 to 7 by a girl that was 4 years older than me, after that I "played" the same "game" she taught me with other kids that were close to my age. It made me feel dirty and I was way too young to be thinking about things like that, let alone doing them.


I was taught about Jesus by my stepdads' parents when I was 8 I believed in Jesus but thought I was going to hell because they told me that homosexuals go to hell. They tried to preach the full gospel to me, but I didn't understand repentance, and I had never told anyone about what happened to me. I felt condemned for years. I experimented with alcohol at the age of 8 and pot at the age of 11. I became an alcoholic as a teenager and was raped two different times while I was blacked out. I started using cocaine at the age of 18 so I wouldn't black out anymore. I met my ex-husband at 19, got pregnant at 20 and had my daughter at 21. I got married while I was pregnant with her. I cut back on the cocaine during this time but was smoking pot instead. I then had my son at 24. I was not faithful in my marriage and in 2011 I got divorced. I thought I wasn't happy because of my ex-husband. I now know that was not true. My life got progressively worse after my divorce. I always believed in Jesus, but I wasn't following him, instead I chased after drugs, sex, and men putting that in front of my relationship with God and my children. In 2016 my mom died of a heroin overdose, that was probably the hardest thing I have ever been through. Two months after she died, my ex-husband took my children away from me to protect them from my downward spiral. My addiction got worse, I started using needles, injecting different drugs, overdosing, and I was terrified that I was going to put my children through the same pain I was going through. I tried multiple secular rehabs, attempted getting sober many times, but Jesus was the only answer. In April of 2024, I went to the Lion's Den mission, I graduated and planned to stay for staff but got into trouble there, I didn't want to transfer somewhere else, so I just left instead. I relapsed 2 days after leaving. I went back to the Lion's Den on May 24, 2025, and got into trouble again. This time I took the transfer to Crossville Mission on August 13, 2025. I'm working on letting go of my past and becoming who God created me to be. I'm looking forward to letting God use me to help others who have been where I have. I surrender it all to him and trust that he will help me fulfill his purpose for my life.





