

¹God said to me, "O mortal, eat what is offered to you; eat this scroll, and go, speak to the house of Israel." ²So I opened my mouth, and God gave me the scroll to eat. ³God said to me, "Mortal, eat this scroll that I give you and fill your stomach with it." Then I ate it, and in my mouth it was as sweet as honey.'

Ezekiel 3:1-3



All superheroes need a good origin story. Peter Parker becomes *Spiderman* when he's bitten by a radioactive spider. Tony Stark becomes *Iron Man* when he creates a suit of armor to save his life. Bruce Wayne becomes *Batman* after his parents are killed by a villain, and he vows to stop crime. Diane Prince becomes *Wonder Woman* after winning a championship among the Amazonian people. Kal-El/Clark Kent becomes *Superman* when his spaceship crashes to earth.

The same is true for "God's Justice League: the Prophets." Isaiah says "Here I am, send me" to God only after an angel with 6 wings touches his mouth with a red-hot coal. Jonah runs away from God's call and is swallowed by a whale. Amos experiences God's word in an earthquake. Micah is a rural farmer who sees a vision of a holy mountain. Ezekiel eats the actual Word of God, swallowing a scroll. Jeremiah protests to being a prophet so God's own hand reaches out to touch his mouth.

Whether they are serving God or the multiverse, a superhero's dramatic call story leads them to help people in need. We may not have been bitten by a radioactive spider or swallowed by a whale ... but we have had monumental experiences of faith. We've each experienced God in powerful ways (and just like those prophetic superheroes, in ways that are different from one another).

This Fall, we are walking alongside the Prophets to discover how we can dramatically serve our communities in our time, just like they did in theirs. Continue joining us in worship as we form our own 'Justice League' and impact our community together.




First Pres


explore the questions and myths associated with homelessness and learn more about IHOC's new initiative. Contact Cheryl Hauske to see if there is still space open to attend.

My name is Tim, and I am from Bridgeton, NJ. I moved when I was 24 to Pennsylvania & Virginia. I have 6 kids and I was not much of a father. I was there. But that's about it. I was trying to find myself for many years.



I was in church when I was younger but strayed away. I got saved in 2003 and I knew God and He has always been close in my life but I felt that I had to experience life and that got me into the wrong things – a lot of dependence on drugs, women, people, money, etc. I got so lost that I forgot where I came from. My mom died and I came back home, 8 months before I came to the Mission. I was blindsided because I was there. I had a good job in PA. A house and sober living for God and I came back here with no plan.

I failed, became homeless and was eating out of the trash. I smoked crack and had no family, as they all turned on me. I was lost. On January 15, 2025 I was in Atlantic City, on a bridge, and I was going to jump, but God had other plans. He sent 2 men to talk to me and they pulled me down.

I was so angry. I wanted all the pain to go away. I had lived with all the physical and emotional stress of a life that I just wanted to end. Within a week, I met a lady who would change my mind. The Holy Spirit moved and I came to the Mission. It's not been easy, but God is the best healer.

Tim is graduating from the program and has accepted a transfer from Mission Teens in Norma, NJ to participate in the Staff Training program in Savannah, GA.

EYOND THE PULPIT:

Pastor Eliza was featured in the most recent publication of *The Heights Report*, as part of a new section called Beyond the Pulpit. If you haven't seen the article it's included below.

Reverend Eliza Cramer Jaremko **Pastor of First Presbyterian Church**

Rev. Eliza Cramer Jaremko has served as the Pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Haddon Heights (FPCHH) since 2011. Originally from the small town of Zelienople, PA (north of Pittsburgh), she felt immediately at home here in our beloved small town of Haddon Heights. Before moving to Haddon Heights, Pastor Eliza served as the Associate Pastor of Crossroads Church (a PC-USA Congregation) in San Antonio, TX and as the Pastoral Assistant at Bensalem Presbyterian Church, Bensalem, PA. She is a graduate of the College of Wooster (BA in English) and earned her Master of Divinity from Princeton Theological Seminary. She is currently pursuing her Doctor of Ministry in Creative Writing and Public Theology from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. With a passion for writing, Pastor Eliza is working on a book of biblically-based historical fiction and a children's book on celebrating noises in worship. She is a contributor to the Presbyterian Outlook and writes on her personal blog "ReverendMama' about parenting in a beautifully chaotic world.

In her role as pastor of FPCHH, Pastor Eliza is proud to lead a friendly and diverse church where EVERYONE is welcome. FPCHH prides itself on inclusivity, respecting all voices, and a genuine care for those in need. With programs for adults and children of all ages, Pastor Eliza loves that there is a place for everyone to learn, grow, and participate in Gods work. While the mission of FPCHH expands globally, much of the work of the congregation is focused locally, supporting organizations like Interfaith Homeless Outreach Council, Interfaith Caregivers, UrbanPromise, Your Food Shelf, local food pantries, providing school supplies to Haddon Heights students, and much more.

Besides leading mission work and teaching Bible studies, Pastor Eliza seeks to creatively explore the Word of God every Sunday morning in Worship (10:30am). This summer's sermon series matched up favorite board games like Clue, Monopoly, and Jenga with biblical stories like King David, Year of Jubilee, and The Tower of Babel. This Fall, Pastor Eliza's sermon series "God's Justice League: Prophets from Then for Now" will explore how to be superheroes for God in our own community.

and Valentina also came. She shared from 2 Corinthians. 2:15, the fragrance of Christ in our lives.




