“All Jesus did that day was tell stories—a long storytelling afternoon. His storytelling fulfilled the prophecy: I will open my mouth and tell stories; I will bring out into the open things hidden since the world’s first day.” Matthew 13:34-45 (MSG)

What a beautiful image Matthew paints for us. Jesus sitting under a tree telling stories. Jesus gathered in a living room in comfy couches, telling stories. Jesus sitting in a rocking chair, telling stories. We often picture Jesus giving sermons or lectures, but how often do we imagine Jesus telling stories all day long?

This Fall, we’ve been exploring the big questions of our faith. In asking these questions, we’ve discovered that Jesus very rarely answers questions directly. Instead, Jesus tells parables – or stories – as an answer to the big questions asked by Pharisees, disciples, and crowds.


Which means that when we are looking for the answers to life’s big questions, God tells us to immerse ourselves in stories – both the stories of the Bible and the stories of our lives. What experiences have we had that have allowed us to have a deeper understanding of God? How can our stories help tell God’s story?

Last week, I was on study leave at Montreat Conference Center in the blue ridge mountains of North Carolina, taking a writing class during their annual Fall Craft Week. Every day, our teacher gave us several writing prompts. We asked to write a story, poem, essay, or personal narrative on the prompt. Some prompts led to writing a fictional story and some led to non-fiction. Yet both were “true.” I found great joy writing fictional pieces, which didn’t necessarily happen, but did convey a meaningful truth.

This is exactly why Jesus uses the paradigm of the parable to tell a fictional story with deep truths about God, about Jesus, about ourselves, and about faithfulness. Continue to join us this Fall in Worship AND Sunday School as we continue to explore our great questions and Jesus’ great stories.

Food Pantry Support







Renew Your Spirit & Join the Fun: Fall Sunday School Classes



I know, I know! You really don't want one more thing to think about when you are shopping. I apologize, but these questions are really easy to answer.

I hadn't given this much thought myself until quite recently. In one day, I had two experiences that reminded me that I could do better.

FIRST, I visited my local pet store to purchase some small bags. (Although we are not supposed to use plastic grocery bags, I do need some kind of little bag to take on walks with my dog.) Well, I picked up a package of bags, and I saw "made with recycled materials." Wonderful!

However, when I got home and opened the package, I realized that I had not read carefully enough. The cardboard packaging was made with recycled materials; the plastic bags were not. I went online to do some research; even though those bags are quite small, they will still take hundreds of years to break down, and there are millions of dogs in the world!

My next thought was that there must be eco-friendly bags available to dog owners. After all, I can find the "made with recycled materials" logo on many other items I purchase. Of course, the answer is "Yes," and I vowed to buy better bags in the future.



SECOND, I collected the mail from my mailbox later that same day. Among other items were two catalogs, each from a different women's store I patronize. For some reason I flipped them over to look at the address panel, where I saw two logos, National Forest Foundation and Sustainable Forestry Initiative. Although I was glad to know that these two companies chose printers that support sustainability efforts, I was also drawn to the secondary message "please recycle this catalog or pass it on ..."

I was forced to ask myself, "Do I really need to get these paper catalogs?" The answer was simply, "No." I can shop in the store or online very easily, and in fact already do! It was time to make a phone call and remove my name from their "wants to receive a print catalog" list.

In conclusion, I am sure that many of you make excellent decisions every day to help preserve God's green earth. The suggestions above are very small steps, but every step matters.

So many of them have burned bridges in family relationships, ruining countless holidays for parents, siblings, and grandparents who've put up with them, hoping for the best, and PRAYED AND PRAYED SOME MORE. God has God's own timetable for when and how our prayers get answered; our part is to grow in trust and continue to seek God through it all.



So, if you have any nice things you don't need, new or gently used, gather and drop them off at 1800 Sycamore St. in Heights. Pat and Tony have moved, but we still have basement space reserved for MT. Gifts can be for women, men, & children of all ages. Our residents love to have some gifts for their families, and we even wrap them up for them. (If you would like to share in the joy - and chaos - of doing the wrapping, ask Pat when the Ladies Auxiliary is driving to the NJ Center in Norma, near Vineland.) The other very important thing we like to do for our staff is give them some cash to shop for their families. You can mail a check made out to Mission Teens, Inc., marked "Staff Christmas" to P.O. Box 131, Glendora, NJ 08029, or hand it to Pat Masi to deliver.

All the Mission Teens staff are unpaid volunteers who go through a year of training, then make a series of 6-month commitments to give back the love they have received. Their days are long, privacy is scarce, and mistakes have serious consequences in the lives of those they shepherd. Everything at Mission Teens depends on God's provision, and that is one of the reasons the program has been successful since 1969. Humanly speaking, addiction is very hard to cure – and it's never just a "cure" - because as Scripture says, "the dog returns to its vomit," so learning to live a sober and productive life requires serious discipleship training. Thank you for all you do to help God's work through Mission Teens!


