Are you standing on Holy Ground? And if so, did you take off your shoes?

We may think that Holy Ground is a special place far away, but anywhere has the potential to be holy ground. In the Exodus narrative, Moses was working outside on a normal day when God appeared in a bush and named that place holy. Throughout the Exodus epic, many places are declared holy: the slave quarters where Moses was born, the Palace where he was raised, the Sea that God parted, the Wilderness where God provided, and the Mountain where God gave commandments. In the most unexpected places, God shows up and declares a place holy.

This fall, we are going in search of the *Holy Ground* in our lives – the places where God shows up. As we walk through the Exodus story together, we'll celebrate the big and small miracles of our lives.

Our journey will culminate with a celebration about our own holy ground at the corner of 7th and Green, as we celebrate our congregation's 125th anniversary.

Why Buying Acme & ShopRite Gift Cards Is a GOOD Idea!

For a few years now Cheryl Hauske has been selling gift cards to ShopRite and Acme. This is a fundraiser for IHOC, as the organization gets **5% of every card sold**. Anyone who shops at either of these stores should take advantage of this opportunity to support IHOC.

- If you generally pay cash for groceries, give the cash to Cheryl and get gift cards to use instead. It's an easy switch. You spend the same amount but now you are also helping IHOC.
- If you usually pay for groceries with a credit card then pay off your credit card balance each month, please rethink that habit. Most credit card companies charge a 3% fee to the grocery store. In effect, you are "donating" 3% of your purchases to the credit card company. Buying gift cards instead means you're donating 5% of your purchases to IHOC. What a blessing! And again, there's no increased cost for you.

For example, **every \$100 gift card = a \$5 donation**. When enough people keep buying gift cards the totals add up to a generous amount of money. Yet, no one spends a single cent more on groceries they are already buying anyway.

Consider giving your grocery buying habit a makeover and make a difference!

Ella B. Chase Memorial Fund Is Open for Applications



One of the blessings that Collingswood Presbyterian Church members brought with them when they joined with First Pres is a fund that had been set up in the 1950s in memory of Ella B. Chase. This is a restricted fund that is only available for education-related purposes. Some examples of these are:

- Financial assistance for a person seeking college, seminary or theological training in preparation for devoting his or her full time to Christian service.
- Prizes or grants to Sunday school members for essays or other achievements.
- Payments to a speaker or speakers not on the pulpit supply list to lecture on aspects of practical Christianity or religious education.
- Grants to attendees of mission work or summer religious camps.
- Other educational purposes the committee deems qualify under the terms of the trust.

The committee which presides over the use of the memorial fund consists of the pastor, president of the Trustees, clerk of Session, a member of the Christian Ed committee, and a member of the Finance Committee. Applications are available for any individual or group seeking funds that qualify under one of the above-listed conditions, or another education-related and committee-approved use.

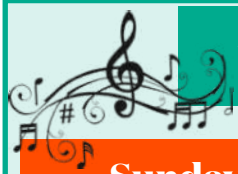
Have a Say in the Church Budget!

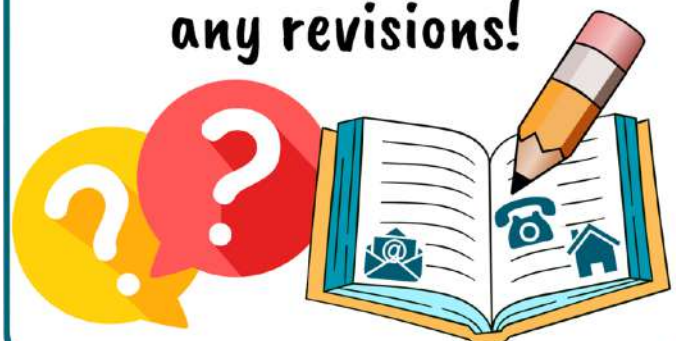

MISSION TEENS

Testimony



Joshua & Whitney Flanders were both residents of the Mission Teens Kentucky Center. Their story continues in the next issue of the Vanguard (MT monthly newsletter).

Hi! Our names are Joshua and Whitney Flanders. Joshua went through the Mission Teen centers in Illinois and Kentucky and has 17 years clean and sober. I went through the program in Kentucky and have 8 years clean. We both struggled deeply with a life of addiction and torment. A life of pain, abuse, sadness, darkness, and absolute evil all around. We were both abused in horrific ways. My body was used in a way that left me full of shame and disgust. We lost everything. We were homeless, in and out of jail. We tried to beat addiction on our own by going to rehab after rehab, but every single time we would relapse and the torment and darkness was worse every time. We lost ourselves, we completely lost the will to live BUT GOD. He heard our cries when we called out to Him. He stepped in and saved our lives. He directed our paths and sent us both to Mission Teens. It's there that we found Him, truly found His grace and His love for us. During our time at Mission Teens, God helped us work through our pain and trauma. He showed us how to use it for the glory of Him and for helping others who are just like us. People who are stuck suffering in addiction, not knowing there is even a way out. I got saved at the Mission and I never looked back. Josh had gotten saved long before he came to the Mission, but he restored his relationship with God while there.

We were surrounded by other brothers and sisters who had been where we were and they knew how to help us overcome the destruction of what our lives in addiction did to us. They showed us the love of Jesus, which I had never in my life experienced. The Mission is full of the Holy Spirit and you succeed. Once you make the decision to do whatever it takes to change your life you have to grab onto the hem of the garment of Jesus and do not let go. Hold onto Him and I promise he will never fail you. Josh had already been through the program many years before we met, but he was volunteering as the Overseer in Kentucky and I was the Senior Counselor at this point. I had no intention of being in a relationship after the abuse I had endured at the hands of many men during my addiction, but God had a plan for my life that I didn't see coming. God knew I needed Josh and that Josh needed me. By the time our staff commitments were up at the Mission, God told us we were not only supposed to be together, but that we were to be married and share a ministry together and that's exactly what we did. We got married on September 26, 2020. I had lost custody of my 3 children during my addiction, and although the case was closed, God reopened that case for me and He granted me back full custody of my 3 children and Josh took on my kids as his own and raised them and has loved them from the day he met them.

Joshua and Whitney's story continues in the next issue.

Mission Update ...

From Pat Masi:

In July we had a first in Mission Teens' 57-year history. A thirteen-year-old young lady graduated from our program in Iowa! To accomplish this she had to learn to get along with a household of vastly different personalities. She had to shoulder increasing responsibility as she moved through the eight-month discipleship program, & finished by overseeing each day's activities as Overseer in the last phase of the program. She is a true miracle & we are so proud of her!

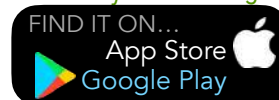

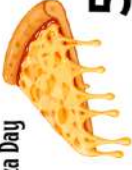
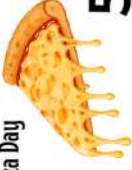
