#### From the PASTOR\_

#### Happy Summer!

Yippee, summer is here and perhaps also summer trips. Summer trips remind me of a weird and wacky family tradition that I would do with our kids when they were younger. The minivan was finally packed - we were all buckled into our seats - ready to start our vacation adventure and I would quote in my best Elwood from the Blues Brothers "We are on a mission of God"! Of course, we were going on a family vacation - but could it also be a "mission of God"?

This summer if we are blessed enough to have a vacation trip - as we leave on vacation and take a break for a few days - are we keeping in mind that we are still "on a mission" to live each moment with and for God? Are we remembering to serve God in everything we do - even on vacation - or do we take a vacation from God?

The apostle Paul encouraged the believers living in Rome, to "not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord" (Romans 12:11). His point was that our life in Jesus is meant to be lived intentionally and with enthusiasm. Even the most mundane moments gain new meaning as we look to God and live for His purposes.

So, as we settle into our vehicle seats for vacation - let us pray, "Lord, I'm yours. Whatever you have for me to do on this trip - please help me not to miss it". Because vacation or not - a summer trip or not - every day is a mission of eternal significance with God.

Perhaps for you maybe summer means an opportunity to relax, renew and restore. And that is biblical. God commands us to take a "sabbath rest". God also warns us against being lazy or slothful - which is very different from "resting".

So let us look again at Romans 12:11 "Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord". Do you ever feel "slothful in zeal"? Paul is talking about feeling sluggish in your relationship with God. Paul is describing a feeling of laziness - a lack of desire. Do you ever feel like your spirit is anything but "fervent"? Webster's Dictionary defines "fervent" as having or displaying a passionate intensity - hot, burning, or glowing. The word "fervent" here is better translated as "boiling over". Do you ever feel like your spirit is more like stagnant water? Yuck! Let's look at how we as followers of God can stir up our excitement for the Lord. Let's make space for God to put "fire" under any area of our spiritual life that feels stagnant - so that it might "boil over".

The key to understanding Romans 12:11 is knowing that God will never ask us to do something or be something without His help. Hallelujah! We are never alone in our spiritual growth. Our job is simply to create space in our heart for God to mold and shape us. Our job is to engage with Him and let the Holy Spirit teach, lead, and fill us. Our Heavenly Father has a perfect plan to guide us into spiritual growth and "fervor". So - in light of that - how can we engage with God and allow Him to mold and shape us into a person of greater "fervor and zeal"?

Psalm 19:7 says, "The law of the Lord is perfect, reviving the soul". And Psalm 19:8 says, "The precepts of the Lord are right, rejoicing the heart". Scripture makes it clear that to be "zealous and fervent" in our service to God - we must spend time allowing His word to "inflame" our spiritual fire. Perhaps this Summer you will have some time to read the Bible about the depths of God's love for His

people - the length He will go for you as His child and the example of lives "empowered" by the Holy Spirit - this should help fill you with "passion and zeal". And perhaps this will help: when you spend time in God's word - you are not only reading incredible stories - but know that you are hearing the voice of your living and active Heavenly Father. Spend time in God's word - allowing the voice of God to direct your soul to finding its rest and passion in Him.

Because when we spend time with God - we will be filled with a desire and passion to serve Him. Take a moment and reflect on how different you feel when you are "inflamed with passion" in comparison to feeling "slothful". You have the power to choose how you will live life every day. You have the choice to engage with God, read His word, spend time in His presence, and allow Him to mold and shape you. And of course - you also have the choice and power to live a passionless life. The choice is yours. But know that God is faithful to fill you with His Holy Spirit every day if you will make space for Him to do so. He has total grace for the times you feel sluggish. And at the same time - God has a perfect plan to lead you out of that state into being "fervent in spirit"! Engage with God today in prayer. Meditate on His word. Let God fill you with the power and anointing of the Holy Spirit!

"The Message" translates Romans 12:11 as "Don't burn out; keep yourselves fueled and aflame. Be alert servants of the Master, cheerfully expectant". May you experience today the life of a "cheerfully expectant" person "fueled" and set "aflame" by the love and leading of God. Let's make a goal this summer to spend time meditating on God's word. Let's ask the Holy Spirit to fill us "afresh". Perhaps let us pray and meditate on Psalm 90:14 "Satisfy us in the morning with your steadfast love, that we may rejoice and be glad all our days". Let us ask the Holy Spirit to show us ways that we can serve God today. God has a specific plan to use you today. God might have you give someone a gift, encourage someone, pray for someone, or just simply engage in conversation with someone. Let us follow the leading of the Holy Spirit as He guides and directs us today and every day.

#### From the Deacon's Desk...

#### ARE YOU STUCK?

Maybe you remember two months ago when I wrote in The Herald about a book I was reading and how we should remember to dance with those we love. It stressed the importance of finding time to spend with those you care about or even things that you enjoy doing and never find the time to do. The book is called "It's Never Too Late to Dance!" by Donald H. Neidigk. As I continue to read through this book I hit another interesting chapter called "Dance with Your Past Into Your Future!". It begins with a Bible verse from Philippians 3:13b-14 "Forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."

Reading this chapter, it reminded me that there were times in my life when I felt frozen in place because I did not feel worthy of God's love. The author points out that sometimes we get stuck in our past wallowing in sorrow, or we let the pain and injustice we experienced long ago determine our present. We may even recite our grievances over and over, clinging to them, unable to think about much of anything else. This can hold us back from dancing with our present or our future.

Neidigk shared of an elderly women who asked him to come to her house to plan her funeral. When he arrived, all she wanted to talk about was her son and how badly he treated her. She wasn't going to leave him anything in her will. There was no forgiveness, there was no love, there was no joy in her life because she kept living with her anger toward her son. She was living in the past fixated on something bad that happened between her and her son.

But do you see what Paul wrote? "Forgetting what lies behind and straining toward what lies ahead". Yes, it is hard sometimes to let things from our past go. Especially when they have been hurtful. I remember hearing that when we hold a grudge against someone it is only hurting ourselves. The person who hurt us knows nothing about how we are holding onto that and how hurt we still might feel, even after years have gone by.

They are living their life not even thinking about what they might have done but we can be holding onto it because we were hurt so deeply. Why do we allow something like this to eat at us?

The author says "Being able to dance with the past means becoming able to look at things soberly and honestly. We don't have to build up a false narrative to justify feeling whatever it is that we feel. We accept reality. We accept the bad. We rejoice in the good. We grieve the loss. And we dance hopefully into the new day, taking with us the scars that never go away but also the experiences that have made us better people."

This past weekend I was away with others from Tabor to celebrate Frank and Peggi Billman's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary. There was a time of sharing our experiences with Frank and Peggi. It reminded me of what another can do in our life to move us forward.

Growing up I was a quiet, shy women never wanting to be the center of attention. Then I got married and started attending Tabor. Although I entered Tabor that quiet woman, Frank and Peggi must have seen something different in me. They challenged me to trust Jesus. That was never something I had done before. But with them reminding me that I am God's child and He would never abandon me if I was being obedient to His calling, I began to step out in faith. Frank invited me on a weekend seminar that he and Peggi were leading. He asked if I would give a short talk (5 minutes) at the seminar we were presenting at another Church. With trepidation I agreed. It wasn't easy but it certainly was the beginning of stepping out in faith and serving God. That was the beginning of life changing experiences for me.

My point in all of this is: I agree we should let go of the painful things that are keeping us stuck in our past. We have difficulty moving forward because we hold onto the hurt like it is a close friend. Unforgiveness of people in our past is a blockage between me and God. But I also see the point of looking at the past. I need to look at the past so that I remember what God has done in my life, especially when I am struggling with a difficult situation in the present. Frank and Peggi encouraged me to be all that I could be for Jesus and taught me how to draw closer to Him. That is a reminder of who God made me to be today. It is important for me to remember where I came from in my faith and where I am today. How about you?

#### MISSIONS UPDATE




The Missions Committee just completed calculating what money we had from 2024 to distribute to our Missionaries. I wasn't sure if you knew this or not, but we support 16 groups who are either serving locally or abroad. Seven of them are couples or individuals serving in another country and one is an organization serving in another state. The rest are local such as our United Methodist Camps, Morning Star Maternity Home, Keystone Opportunity Network, Liberty Ministries and a Shores of Grace in Philadelphia.

The way the Missions Committee works is that we wait a whole year to see what was given. For example, in June of 2025 we figured out what was given in 2024 and that is our budget. We were lucky last year to keep funds almost up to par with 2023 because one of our Memorial Funds gave a nice contribution to Missions. I wanted you to be aware that we DO NOT receive any money from the General Fund of the Church. Our budget comes from individuals who have a passion for Missions and every once and awhile contributes specifically to the Missions Fund. In addition, all cash donations on Christmas Eve and Easter are earmarked for Missions. I bring this to your attention because I wanted you to be aware of how we get the funds for our Missionaries. I am not trying to get you to take away what you give specifically to the Church's General Fund but if you are looking to support our Missionaries, then you can give what you have left over directly to the Missions Fund.

You may recall that one of our Mission Groups was here recently. That was Dale and Beth Nafziger. They came with their nephew Phil Hunsberger who both Diane Althouse and I know and had served with Phil on our own Mission trips. As a reminder, Dale spoke to us during our Worship Service and told us about how he ended up in Nepal and eventually met his wife, Beth. Dale came just prior to retiring as a Missionary with Mennonite Missions Network. Dale and Beth recently sent us a picture of them with a Thank You. Although we had been supporting them for years, this was the first time that Dale visited Tabor Church. But they were very faithful to send us updates by mail. As a

matter of fact, I have on my desk a sample bag of coffee that they sent the Church which is the coffee they make in Nepal.

But as their final goodbye and thanks, you will see a picture and thank you for our support over the years. If you think about it, pray for them as they continue to live in Nepal. But I would bet they will not give up speaking to people about Jesus and helping those in need.



Although they no longer need our financial support and have now officially retired, I am sure they would love for us to continue praying for them. So when Missionaries come to mind, pray for them and include Dale and Beth.

There are others on our list that are heading towards retirement or have found it more and more difficult to serve full time in Missions where they have been planted. I put this out there so that if you think of a Missionary who needs support, let me know and I will bring it to the committee for discussion.

I want to thank those of you who often think of our Missionaries and give financially to the Missions Fund. When we work on our Missions budget each year, we give thanks to God that there is even money there to support those who are working in the fields to show others Christ's love.


What architect drew the plan? Where did that little watermelon seed get its tremendous strength? Where did it find its flavoring extract and its coloring matter?

You will need:


- 1/2 gallon cardboard milk carton




