#### From the PASTOR\_

#### Happy November!

The election is reaching a fever pitch and regardless of who wins - there will be many people who will not be happy because of the large political division in our country. Also, the holidays are coming which can also mean people getting together - some we probably get along with and maybe some that we don't - so how do we deal with difficult people? Have you ever been with someone who tires you out? Perhaps they are mad at everything and always complaining. They never seem to be satisfied or happy. And isn't it wonderful when their negativity is eventually directed to you and they point out your shortcomings? In those moments it can be very hard not to throw negativity right back in their face, right?

Romans 8:5-6 says that, "those who live according to the flesh have their minds set on what the flesh desires, but those who live in accordance with the Spirit have their minds set on what the Spirit desires."

The meaning of "the flesh" describes a person who follows their own desires and emotions without considering God. On the other hand, a person who follows according to the Spirit is someone who believes that God loves them so much that He offers a better way of life. And as a result, they seek - or set their mind on God as they navigate the ups and downs of life. And the Bible describes the types of things that the Holy Spirit can work in us. Things like patience, kindness, love and self-control. Even when someone isn't "easy" to be around.

So, if you're dealing with someone in your life who drives you up a wall and makes you want to repay evil with evil or insult with insult - maybe just stop, take a breath, and pray. And ask the Holy Spirit for

help. Then with God's help we will be able to overcome evil with good (Romans 12:21). And spend some time thinking about Romans 8:5-6 and what it would look like to set your mind on the Holy Spirit. Regardless of the circumstances and the people around you - the Holy Spirit can fill you with life and with peace. So, trust in God in every situation and in all circumstances and find the help that you need.

Perhaps it might be helpful to consider all of the containers in your house - whoa way too many - okay, how about all the containers in your bathroom? Maybe even in the smallest room of your house there are many containers. A liquid soap dispenser pumps out precise servings. A toothpaste tube applies a straight line of toothpaste across a toothbrush. A container might hold your prescriptions for each day of the week. And let's call these various containers a "vessel". And let us note that every vessel serves a unique purpose - to provide access to its contents.

1 Corinthians 6:19 "Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God?" Yes, Paul was pleading with the Corinthians to avoid sexual immorality with their bodies - but included with that is the greater principle that the reality for believers is that our bodies are God's home on earth. And because our bodies are God's dwelling place - His container - our vessel, our body - then we need to take seriously the command to keep them pure so that others might access the contents we contain - God, Himself, through the Holy Spirit.

More often than not - we distress over our bodies well aware of their imperfections. 1 Corinthians 6:19 offers us a new perspective on our old bodies - our vessels contain the very essence of God - and give

others access to knowing the Son of God, Jesus Christ
- as we know Him, as Lord and Savior! Yes, a vessel
is a container that provides access to its contents. So,
the next time you look in the mirror - can you view
your body - as a vessel - as a holy container - that
allows others a glimpse of God!

This is important because your candidate may win - or not. And as history has shown us - both political parties obviously have won at times and also lost. It's an interesting history how presidential elections have shifted back and forth between political parties over the years. So knowing the historical fact that your political party is not always going to win - let us listen and embrace God's command in Romans 8:5-6 to live in accordance with the Holy Spirit and set our minds on what the Spirit desires - love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control (Galatians 5:22-23). And let others see God who is living in you!

I am praying that whoever wins - that they will pray to God, listen to God and obey God's leading. And let us remember it is our job to pray for our leaders regardless of their political party (1 Timothy 2:1-2).

#### From the Deacon's Desk...

#### "GOD IS WITH YOU"

I was reading about a promise in Scripture that I really believe but often need to be reminded of it. It comes from Exodus where Moses sees the burning bush and God asks him to bring his people, the Israelites, out of Egypt. Moses is not sure if he can do this and questions God. God does not say to Moses why he has been selected, what his qualifications are or what they aren't. God does not try to build Moses up or give him a pep talk. The answer Moses gets when he asks the question "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?" (Ex. 3:11) God's response is "And God said I will be with you." (Ex. 3:12)

How much do you believe or trust this promise? Did you know it can be found a lot in Scripture? I am extremely thankful for this promise and the many promises contained in Scripture. Do you understand that this promise is for the people of Ukraine, the people of Israel and for us as well? Do you also understand that even in the midst of a war like Ukraine and Israel are facing, God still says "I will be with you"? Do you believe that God is with you as you struggle financially, struggle with illness, struggle with what is going on in even our own country? Or even your own life?

Let's go back to Moses. The God of the cosmos made an appearance through an unburning bush on the far side of the wilderness to an octogenarian sheep herder and said he was sending him to rescue and deliver a nation of a million or more slaves from their oppressor. What has He asked you to do that seems impossible? Have you questioned God as to why and whether you actually had what He needed to do it? I know I have.

But the good news is that in all our quandaries about impossible things and our questioning inquiries about improbable outcomes, God always responds with "I will be with you." Isn't that awesome?

And He reminds us of this in other books of the Bible and in the New Testament as well. In Matthew 28:18-20 we have what is called the Great Commission which reminds us "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to you. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations... and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." And it ends with this "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." So we are called to go out and teach about God and His commands and promises and through it all, Jesus will be with us.

So you see that God was with Moses when he was called to do something way bigger than him. And now we are reminded that as we attempt to reach others to come to know Him, we have the promise that Jesus will be with us always. Of course, that promise isn't only when we are trying to reach out to others. I believe that promise is for us even in our day to day lives when we are doing something for Him specifically or whether we are just trying to get through a day with all that is going on.

As we are studying David in Sunday School, I thought it important to begin with some background to David's story. We began with Eli the priest and his taking Samuel under his wing to prepare him to be a priest rather than us jumping right into David. As part of that story we read one night while Samuel was sleeping, he heard a voice calling his name. He ran to Eli thinking it was him. Eli told him to go back to bed. This happened several times and finally Eli says to Samuel to say to the voice, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." (1 Samuel 3:10).

Being reminded that God is with You, I am hoping that this encourages you to be obedient to God. When you believe God is calling you to do some ministry for Him, will you answer Him by saying "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening"? You also have the added blessing of knowing that He will be with you whatever He is calling you to do. So, if God is with us all the time, doesn't He have the opportunity to speak to us as well? Sorry to say this but, this gives you no reason to not be obedient to God calling you especially if it is something that seems impossible to you. If He promises to be with you, God will also guide you and give you all that you need to accomplish His plans. He never leaves us out there on our own, especially when we are being obedient to Him.

In this month of Thankfulness (which of course we should be doing every month) let us give thanks to God for desiring to use us and His promise to provide all that we need to serve Him.

## Holiday (andle


On Thanksgiving, we share a special meal with family and friends. Make this holiday candle as a festive centerplace for your table.

#### What you need:

- Paper towel
- One 8-oz. clear plastic cup
- Petroleum jelly (Vaseline)
- Paper or plastic disposable bowl
- About 8 oz. of a variety of dried beaus, peas, com, etc.
- Borde of white glue
- Plastic spoon
- · An 8- to 10-inch taper or dinner candle
- Adult to help

#### What you do:


- 1. Using the paper towel, rub a generous amount of petroleum jelly on the inside of the cup (bottom and sides).
- 2. In a bowl, pour the dried-bean mixture.
- Squeeze enough glue into the bean mixture to generously coat it. Stir the mixture with the spoon.
- Spoon about half of the bean. mixture into the greased cup. Then place the candle, with any plastic wrapping removed, into the center of the mixture. Next, fill the cup with the rest of the mixture. Smooth the top to make it flat, making sure the candle stays straight.
- 5. Squeeze extra glue around the hole made by the candle. Let the bean mixture dry completely, which could take a day or longer.
- When the beam mixture is dry, gently pull the candle. Both the candle and beans should come out as one. (If they don't, pour more glue and wait another day.)
- Place your candle on a small. plate for a festive Thanksgiving centerpiece.


