From the PASTOR—

Happy December!

"Of all the months of the year there is not a month one half so welcome to the young, or so full of happy associations, as the last month of the year."

-Charles Dickens

Yes, it is a month – a time that is often welcomed with festivities and joy! When you were a kid - what part of Christmas brought you the most joy? Decorating the Christmas Tree, baking cookies, watching the holiday specials on TV? Or perhaps it was getting gifts! Sure, let's act mature and humble and we may try to deny or at least downplay it - but as kid – one of the best parts of Christmas for me was getting presents! Sure, you can call me materialistic and many other words - but I loved getting my Christmas gifts! I loved getting the Sears "Wishbook" catalog and looking at all the toys and gadgets! Sure, I knew that Christmas was about Jesus - and Jesus was the greatest gift of all - but I would be lying if I didn't admit that I loved getting Christmas gifts! For me - opening presents was one of the best things about Christmas!

Maybe you would sneak around the house – trying to find out where the presents were hidden? Maybe you gave that wrapped box a good shake on Christmas morning – trying to guess what was inside. Were you a kid who tore into the wrapping paper or the one who carefully unwrapped your gift?

Somewhere along the way – perhaps with maturity – Christmas becomes more fun to give presents. We know Jesus said "It is more blessed to give than to receive". [Side fun fact – do you know where in the Bible Jesus said that? Which Gospel? It is an interesting instance of a partial scripture where Paul is speaking in Acts 20:35 and recalling what Jesus said – and Paul most likely was taught this amazing teaching of Jesus from someone else – but it was

never recorded in any of the Gospels]. Okay – now back to when we discovered the joy to give presents. Maybe it was a sweet and special gift for a new boyfriend or girlfriend. Maybe it was the perfect gag gift for your brother. Maybe it was something to thank your parents. Maybe it was the toy your child had been dreaming of but didn't think was coming. That's the thing about gifts – there's joy in receiving and joy in giving.

Another part of the joy of Christmas is reflecting upon the first Christmas. Long ago, in a manger in Bethlehem, God gave His people the gift they had been waiting for thousands of years. It was the gift that had been prophesied about. It was the gift that had been hoped for. It was the gift that God promised Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden. When our Heavenly Father gave us the gift of Jesus – there was indeed joy on Earth! That was the message of the angels. Luke 2:10 The angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people".

Rejoice – to feel or show great joy. The shepherds rejoiced. The Wise Men rejoiced. Mary and Joseph rejoiced. Simeon and Anna rejoiced. There was great joy! And the joy didn't stop there. As Jesus grew and began His ministry – He performed miracles – restoring joy to the lives of the crippled, the possessed, and the outcast.

After Jesus rose from the dead and ascended to Heaven – the disciples spread the good news of the Gospel joy in their city and around the world. Many years later – you and I have the same joy that the shepherds and the crippled and the disciples had!

But like a child who is excited about a toy on Christmas and bored with it by New Year's Day – we do not always live in the joy that Jesus gives. I grumble about how busy I am at this time of year. I gossip and talk negatively about people who are (Continued on next page)

difficult to deal with. I envy others that have more time and less things to do than me. I over extend myself. I buy things "to feel better". I try to find a movie or TV show that will make me happy. In a sense – I try to make my own joy and chase after the joy that this world promises rather than drawing on the endless supply of heavenly joy in Jesus. I'm so glad that you are not like me – because that way of life is exhausting and not working for me!

But as we said earlier – joy is not just in the receiving – it's also in the giving. Here is possibly something different for you this Christmas. You probably have heard of this Bible verse before – maybe around Easter – but did you ever think of it as a "Christmas Bible verse"? Well let's give it a try – Hebrews 12:2 "fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before Him, He endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God". Wow! I have never thought of Jesus' rescue mission as one of joy – but now I see it! According to Hebrews 12:2 Jesus came to the earth and went to the cross "for the joy set before Him". That "joy" was you! That joy was me!

Did God "give" His one and only Son "joyfully" because it meant a restored relationship with His creation? YES! It brought God joy to send his Son to a broken, fallen world – because of LOVE! John 3:16 "For God so loved the world (you and me) that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life".

Jesus was joyfully Emmanuel – God with us. Jesus joyfully walked among His creation – healing, forgiving, and bringing joy to those He touched. And according to Hebrews 12:2 Jesus joyfully endured the horrors of the cross – because He wanted you and me to have the eternal joy of being with God in glory forever.

God took great <u>joy</u> in you – you are His creation and child. It is not just we who received Jesus – who are <u>joyful</u>. It is God Himself – who loves you and me so much that He <u>joyfully</u> sent Jesus to earth to bring the creation He <u>joyfully</u> made and called good – and returned us back to Himself. Think about your joy this way: <u>Your joy doesn't come from you. It comes from God, who first delighted in you.</u> The <u>joy</u> of Christmas is eternal because God is eternal. The <u>joy</u> of Christmas never dies because – in Christ – you have eternal life. The <u>joy</u> of Christmas never fades

away because every day we need God's forgiveness and every day we should **rejoice** that the forgiveness is ours and is real because of His Son, Jesus Christ!

Our joy is in God – who first loved us and rejoiced in our redemption. We don't have to chase after the world's joy – which fades away. We can be joyful in our "work" – even when there is a lot of it and your boss may be a jerk – because that work is from God. We are joyful in our relationships – even when the other person is disagreeable, difficult and rude – because it was God's pleasure to take sinful attitudes and hurtful words to the cross. We are joyful in our financial situation – whatever it may be – because we know that if our Heavenly Father did not even spare His own Son for our eternal good – He will certainly provide for our earthly needs!

Even if we are stressed, suffering from anxiety, depression or busyness – because of our Heavenly Father – we can have **joy** this Christmas season. I believe that is the world that baby Jesus arrived to – and those who saw Him – **rejoiced!** So let us **rejoice!** We can **rejoice** that we have received forgiveness and salvation from God who **joyfully** gave up everything to be born a baby in a manger.

Some people say that "joyful" can also mean "merry" – so think about all the above when you hear or say "Merry Christmas"!

From the Deacon's Desk...

OUR HOPE AND ASSURANCE IS IN......

I read a story which was attributed to author and poet Robert Louis Stevenson. The story says that he was traveling once on a ship that ended up in a severe storm and imminent danger of sinking. Many of the passengers began to whisper to one another, "Are we going down? Are we safe?" Eventually, one brave soul volunteered to travel up to the pilot house and see the captain.

The passenger made his way through the rain and wind and stepped in to the shelter to see that the pilot of the ship was standing calmly with his hands firmly on the wheel. The passenger, filled with fear, witnessed the captain slowly turn and make eye contact with him. Without saying a word, the captain simply smiled. That was it. No words, just a smile. Apparently, that was all that the passenger needed to see.

As the passenger traveled back down to the main cabin, the once-fearful passenger exclaimed, "We're going to be all right. I have seen the face of the captain and, good news: he smiled at me."

It is easy for us to run into turbulence in our world today. You don't have to look very far to see stories in the news of conflict, heartache or tragedy to find our hope and assurance amidst the uncertainties and storm we see raging in the world. In the midst of this, where is our hope and assurance coming from in the midst of uncertain times?

To people in captivity Isaiah reminded the Israelites of a light that was on the horizon. Isaiah said that the time of deep darkness was coming to an end and with it a promise "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And He will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." (Isaiah 9:6). Although this promise came through a tiny child, how could all of these big titles fit into such a small package? Let us take some time to reflect on these.

Jesus is our Wonderful Counselor. He is the wonder of God found in human form. Isaiah also said about this child "The Spirit of the Lord will rest on him – the Spirit of wisdom and understanding,

the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of the knowledge and fear of the Lord." (Isaiah 11:2) He doesn't hold office hours and His counsel is available to all who ask for it.

Jesus is our Almighty God. He is not just the wonder of God found in human form but He is literally Almighty. He is the same Jesus who calmed the wind and waves, told the demons where to go, healed the broken and afflicted. We may not have it all together. But good news: He is not just all together; He is All Mighty.

Jesus is also our Everlasting Father. A picture of our Everlasting Father comes in the story of the Prodigal son. It is not a temporary love. It is not a contractual love. It does not depend on what we do. It is an everlasting love that the Father has for you. No matter how far we wander from the Father, He will always be there to welcome us back home.

And Jesus is also our Prince of Peace. Just as a Prince works to bring peace and unity to his kingdom, Jesus brings peace into the hearts of every believer. To His Disciples he said "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (John 14:27). As we are also reminded in Scripture Jesus gives a peace that passes all understanding (Phil. 4:7) which is a gift ready to be unwrapped and claimed this very moment.

Just from this one verse we can be reminded of the promise that Isaiah spoke about. That we believe in a God who is a Wonderful Counselor, the Almighty God, Everlasting Father and Prince of Peace. Of course, God's Word reminds us of even more that God can and will do for us, His children. I think that we sometimes worry more about the situation we are facing, more than the One who stands with us when we are uncertain and struggling. Hopefully, you have figured out that our hope and assurance comes from God, who loves us so much that He sent Jesus to come and be in relationship with us. He adopted us as His children. And as His children, we are entitled to all He has to offer.

So, if you feel you have a storm raging in your life, take a moment and catch the eye of the one whose hands are firmly at the wheel, and then remind yourself of the following: "I am going to be all right. I have seen the face of the Captain and good news, He smiled at me. And He desires to walk with me revealing to me all He has to offer"

The "A Candymaker's Witness" Story is submitted by Robin Moyer and is dedicated in Memory of and in Honor of Loved Ones ...

A CANDYMAKER'S WITNESS

A candymaker in Indiana wanted to make a candy that would be a witness, so he made the Christmas Candy Cane. He incorporated several symbols for the birth, ministry, and death of Jesus Christ.

He began with a stick of pure white, hard candy. White to symbolize the Virgin Birth and the sinless nature of Jesus; and hard to symbolize the Solid Rock, the foundation of the Church, and firmness of the promises of God.

The candymaker made the candy in the form of a "J" to represent the precious name of Jesus, who came to earth as our Savior. It could also represent the staff of the "Good Shepherd" with which He reaches down into the ditches of the world to lift out the fallen lambs who, like all sheep, have gone astray.

Thinking that the candy was somewhat plain, the candymaker stained it with red stripes. He used three small stripes to show the stripes of the scourging Jesus received by which we are healed. The large red stripe was for blood shed by Christ on the cross so that we could have the promise of eternal life.

Unfortunately, the candy became known as a candy cane – a meaningless decoration seen at Christmas time. But the meaning is still there for those who "have eyes to see and ears to hear.' I pray that this symbol will again be used to witness TO THE WONDER OF JESUS AND HIS GREAT LOVE that came down at Christmas and remains the ultimate and dominate force in the universe today.


