

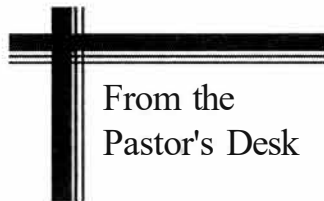

From Ashes to New Life: Honest Repentance Finds Its Answer at the Empty Tomb

As we step from the solemn days of Lent into the radiant dawn of Easter, the journey of honest repentance reaches its joyful fulfillment. This Lenten season, we have walked through six themes drawn from the Easter Vigil readings-Law, Chaos, Faith, Repentance, Purification, and Salvation. Together they have called us not to hide from our sin like Adam, but to sit honestly in the ashes, grieving how we have wrecked the good life God designed for us. We have seen God's law not as a crushing burden but as loving boundaries where life flourishes. We have faced the chaotic waters of wrath and doubt, learning that faith holds fast to God's promises even when they seem contradicted by our circumstances. We have watched the fire of repentance consume our old selves or burn away only the ropes that bind our truest desires, so that we become more fully human, not less. Yet none of this would be possible without Easter. On Good Friday we will stand at the cross and watched the temple of Christ's body return to dust under the ancient curse: "Dust you are, and to dust you will return." The weight of our sin-the rubble of our ruined "houses," the chaos that overwhelms us, the ropes that twist our noblest impulses-pressed down on Him completely. For three days the tomb held what looked like final defeat. But Sunday morning is coming. The stone is rolled away. The tomb is empty. The One who had been consumed by wrath rose again, untouched by death's final claim. In that moment, every Lenten truth was answered. The same power that separated the waters at Creation and at the Red Sea now opens a path through death itself. The promise that was stronger than Abraham's anxiety is now proven unbreakable. The fire that purifies does not destroy us because Christ has already stood in it for us.

This is the daily reality the Small Catechism calls "the daily use of baptism." Every morning we die again with Christ in honest repentance; every morning we rise with Him in newness of life. Sin no longer defines us. The old Adam drowns, and the new man-fully alive, free, and human as God intended-steps forward.

So this Easter, let the empty tomb be more than a story. Let it be your story. Whatever rubble, chaos, or ropes you carried through Lent, bring them to the risen Lord. He has already turned them into resurrection ground. Walk out of the tomb with Him into spring's green hope and the full, abundant life He promised: "I came that they might have life, and have it to the full" (John 10:10).

May this Easter fill your homes and hearts with the same power that raised Jesus-and raises us every day.



Tithing: A Spiritual Decision and More

Giving is our response of faith to God's countless gifts especially the gift we need the most, which is a Savior. God wants us to give willingly and cheerfully out of hearts filled with love and gratitude for our present and eternal lives. By the power of the Holy Spirit through Word and Sacrament, we are molded and transformed into stewards who become more Christ-like in our giving.

We were created in God's image to give, but, because of sin, we have lost that image and giving can be challenging and difficult. However, God exhorts us to give, and, by His grace, He enables our giving. In the Old Testament, God commanded His people to tithe. A tithe is giving to God a tenth of all that is received. As New Covenant Christians living under grace, tithing is not commanded, but it is an expectation and guide to our faithful giving. Tithing is more of a **spiritual decision** than a financial one. It has little to do with money, but it has to do with our devotion to Christ. When we tithe, it could be said that the heart takes precedence over the wallet. Tithers understand who they are and Whose they are. Tithing is a reminder that God is the creator and source of all that we are and have. Tithers are willing to forgo some of the pleasures and comforts of the world to please, honor, and worship God through their giving.

God's Word shares giving truths to guide our giving. We are encouraged to give to God first (Proverbs 3:9), regularly (1 Corinthians 16:2), proportionately (2 Corinthians 8:12), intentionally (2 Corinthians 9:7), and generously (Luke 6:38). It is important to note that these Biblical guides to our giving are all incorporated in the tithe. What is most beneficial is that tithing helps us answer the question, "What is a proportionate gift of our incomes that is God-pleasing?" For financial reasons, it may be difficult for some to become tithers immediately, whereas others will be in position to give much more than a tenth. The tithe is a guide or goal to strive for and then attempt to surpass.

The tithe is also a **spiritual discipline**. Tithing establishes an important priority in our lives, and our tithing helps us to stay connected to Jesus. In addition, tithing is **spiritual protection**. Jesus said, "*Where your treasure is there your heart will be also*" (Matthew 6:21). Giving helps align our hearts with the Lord. Through the joy of tithing and the extra measure of God's peace from faithful and obedient giving, tithers receive **spiritual blessings**. To summarize, tithing is a **spiritual decision** that leads to **spiritual discipline, spiritual protection, and spiritual blessings**. For these reasons, it is said that once a tither always a tither.

May God bless and keep us in His grace and joy as we give to Him!
