

Moses was a great man who was used mightily by God. Moses was able to escape the genocide of his time by being floated in a basket down the river into the arms of Pharaoh's daughter. He spent forty years

as a son of Pharaoh, until was forced to flee for murdering an Egyptian. He ran to Midian where he met Jethro, a priest of Midian. Jethro offered Moses the hand of his daughter and they became family. Moses lived with Jethro for forty years before God called Moses to return to Egypt and free God's people.

Moses was uniquely suited to this task. Being raised in the courts of the Pharaoh, Moses knew the customs, courtesies, and culture of Egyptian royalty, skills that would help him interact with Pharaoh and negotiate the release of the Hebrews. Likewise, Moses had spent time with Jethro in the wilderness. He would have the skills to help thousands of people navigate the unfamiliar areas as the Hebrews travelled from Egypt to the Promised Land.

As great as Moses was, he wasn't perfect. Jethro, his father-in-law, helped him to see this.

When Moses and the Hebrews made it to the wilderness around Midian, Jethro came to pay him a visit. They took some time to catch up and then, in the morning, Jethro went with Moses for his duties. The next day Moses sat to judge the people, and the people stood around Moses from morning till evening. When Moses' father-in-law saw all that he was doing for the people, he said, "What is this that you are doing for the people? Why do you sit alone, and all the people stand around you from morning till evening?" (Ex 18:13-14). Moses explained that he was settling the disputes of the people, both great and small. Even though it was a difficult task, he felt that it was his to do. Jethro responds, "What you are doing is not good. You and the people with you will certainly wear yourselves out, for the thing is too heavy for you. You are not able to do it alone" (Ex 18:17b-18). Jethro then goes on to explain a better system for dealing with disputes by dividing people into smaller groups to settle minor disputes better. Moses had the humility and wisdom to follow Jethro's suggestions. He was blessed to have an outside opinion to help him evaluate what he Continue > > > was doing.

Now is also a good time for us to evaluate what we are doing. Our DCE position is vacant and the quickest we can expect to fill that position is nine months, but twelve is more realistic. Likewise, the Boards of Education, Evangelism, and Stewardship are all vacant with no one to take on those roles on the Church Council. The temptation for us is to put our heads down, put our nose to the grindstone, and power through trying to do what we've been doing for years. If we take that approach, the words of Jethro would ring true for us, too: "What you are doing is not good. You and the people with you will certainly wear yourselves out…"

Now is a good time for us to take a fresh look at things. At our August meeting, the Church Council agreed to start exploring new options for this new season at Mt. Calvary. I've reached out the Rev. Dr. Keith Haney, an assistant to the President of Iowa District West, who specializes in organizational change. I've asked him to meet with a group from the Council to look at where we're headed as a congregation and what the future looks like for our congregation and the community.

Even though things are changing a bit, the grace of our ever-present Lord, Jesus Christ, is with us. He will keep us and bless us to the end. To Him belongs all praise and glory!





Quarterly


• We will schedule one activity per quarter for MS and HS youth, like bowling, Sky Zone, Christmas party, etc.
