TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: LUKE 1:26-38

ADVENT: HOPE - GOD STEPS IN

Each year around Christmas, we take the four Sundays to celebrate Advent together as church. "Advent" is a word that means "a coming." The coming of a King! How does this King Jesus come into the world? How will this Messiah enter into His creation? Well, in our sermons each



Sunday, we're going to be analyzing and working through passages from the Gospel of Luke. Notice how the first three chapters of Luke start. Each chapter starts with a king, or a political ruler, someone with power and authority. Is this how Jesus will come? No, in fact, those rulers are a literary foil to contrast the humble, lowly, advent of the one true King. And, I wonder, is this your King? Is Jesus your King? Have you given your life in allegiance to Jesus, the King? And if you have, imagine the humility that He would produce in our lives this season. Not power, not success, not health and wealth, but a heart of humility, generosity, and kindness. And may these each be paired with Joy, and Peace, Love, and Hope this Advent season.

COMMUNITY GROUP DISCUSSION GUIDE

Take time to think through these questions and write down some responses as you prepare to meet with your group.

READ	THINK	PRAY	STUDY	RETURN
Try to read the study text at least 5x this week. Get familiar with the flow of thought, the main idea, and major divisions.	Meditate on the truth of the text letting it resonate in your heart throughout the day. Chew on what you learn. Fight forgetfulness.	Pray through the text, asking God to teach you His Word so that you can know it and apply it. Praise him for the truths revealed in this passage	Seek to answer the questions below. They are intended to help you read carefully, think clearly, and pray specifically	Bring this sheet with the fruit of your study. Be prepared to discuss the passage. If other questions arise as you study, bring those too!

Israel waited a long time before God fulfilled his promise of a Messiah. What are some of the most difficult aspects of waiting for you? Think of questions that are provoked, discouragements that are awakened, resources that are tapped, and doubts that loom large when we are waiting. What encouragement can you glean from stories of waiting found in God's Word? When have you had to wait a long time for God to answer prayer or help you in difficulty? What made it difficult to wait? What have been some of the most helpful things for you in your times of waiting?

Qabriel said in Luke 1:37 that nothing would be impossible for God. What are some of the ways you see God showing his power and might in Scripture? How do these verses help you take God at his word about his promises?

3 Discuss the following thought from Donald Macleod about the virgin birth. "The virgin birth is posted on guard at the door of the mystery of Christmas; and none of us must think of hurrying past it. It stands on the threshold of the New Testament, blatantly supernatural, defying our rationalism, informing us that all that follows belongs to the same order as itself and that if we find it offensive there is no point in proceeding further." (The Person of Christ, 37) What stands out to you personally as a significant aspect of the virgin birth? Why do you think God chose this path to fulfill His promise about sending God the Son to earth? What responses should we have to this miraculous work?
