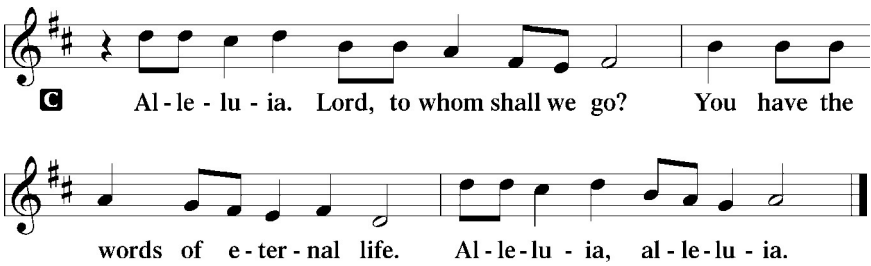
Epistle Romans 8:12–17
