
I hope we've made it through the worst of the cold weather now! And as it gets above freezing today, I pray none of you discover burst pipes!

Have you ever participated in Secret Sisters? I have, and it's a great way to connect with another "sister" in our church that you might not otherwise get to know. Here's what it involves:


- Each participant fills out a Personal Profile Sheet at the Women's Winter Event on February 3. Participants should be college age and above and part of our Burleson Church family.
