1. What stood out to you in today's gathering?
2. When has King Jesus interrupted your plans in a dramatic (or quiet) way? Have you ever been in a season where God stripped away your self-reliance and left you disoriented? How did that lead to seeing Jesus more clearly?
3. Jesus says Saul is His "chosen instrument" and that He will show Saul "how much he must suffer" for His name. Why does Jesus pair great calling with great suffering?
4. In his Romans commentary, John Stott says "To be 'saved' is to be rescued **from** sin and judgment, certainly, but it is also to be rescued **for** righteousness and **for** God.
