The first Sunday home we were welcomed back to the USA by our sending church and invited to share during the Sunday School hour. After a few days to recover from jet lag, it seems like we hit the ground running. The first couple of weeks was kind of an initial settling-in but without our household belongings which were due to arrive from Cyprus several weeks later. But we had to buy a car. And praise the Lord, we found a 2008 Toyota Highlander that we could buy with cash from the sale of our 2016 Honda Fit we had in Cyprus. Knowing we had a car; we could settle in a few ways... one way was Ted's routine of working from home. But we still needed to go to our US office. So, part of April was spent at our TWR office in North Carolina to see Ted's supervisor in person and especially to meet with those who could explain the finance and insurance adjustments that would happen with our status changing to 'domestic missionaries'.

On MAY 1st our grandson, Tristan, was born. We were so anxious to meet him and as soon as we could, we headed to South Bend, Indiana, to meet him. Of course, on the way we had to see good friends and supporters and had a refreshing and encouraging time with them! After a few weeks with our new grandson and Kerith and Brendan in Indiana, we picked up Micah from Moody and drove back together to South Dakota.

**JUNE** was the month for Ted to settle in to early online meetings and planning for fall trainings. And I was busy with wedding preparations. We finalized plans for a tent, caterer, the flowers and prepared our yard and home for Tabitha and Andrew's Stateside sequel-wedding celebration.

**JULY** found us in Taiwan for Andrew and Tabitha's Taiwan wedding. It was a wonderful adventure filled with meeting Andrew's parents and brother, preparations, visiting old friends and enjoying the celebration. Returning from Taiwan, we had a week to finish preparations for the sequel wedding before Andrew and Tabitha arrived. Kerith, Brendan and Tristan drove over from Indiana to join in the celebrations and spend time with the new couple. My sister joined us with her family as well.

So, in AUGUST for a couple of weeks, the Dakota Manor was full of fun, chaos, and lots of people. After each family had departed, we tried to find "normal" and settle in again. Ted had TWR work and ministry to focus on and we had some mission conferences to prepare for.

In SEPTEMBER my sister, Heather, and her husband, Sisa, returned to Dakota Manor to haul their belongings back to their new house in Montana. The next day, Ted and I left for our road trip. Our counselling time was postponed until the following week in **OCTOBER.** We are so glad that it turned out this way because after counselling we were more than ready to head back to South Dakota. We drove straight through! The month of October looked a bit more like settling in yet we were in a different church every Sunday sharing TWR ministry updates.
