Beale states, "The epilogue now shows clearly that the purpose of the book is to induce holy obedience among God's people so that they may receive the reward of salvation. No less than eight of the final fifteen verses underscore this intention through either exhortations to obedience, blessings promised in response to holy living, or warnings of judgment for unholy living... The main point of the whole book is that faithful endurance and obedience to the end will result in eternal blessing and reward, with the ultimate result of glorifying God and Christ." Do you agree with Beale's understanding of the purpose of Revelation?
