2. How are Acts 28:23 and Luke 24:27, 44-45 similar? What does this teach us about how we interpret and understand the Old Testament Scriptures?
3. Are you disappointed that Luke doesn't tell us what happens to Paul, or Peter for that matter? Why do you think Luke didn't include more information on Peter and Paul?
4. I. Howard Marshall wrote, "Whatever be the truth [about Paul's life and death], the fate of Paul is secondary to that of the gospel... Nothing that men can do can stop the progress and ultimate victory of the gospel." Does the book of Acts encourage you as a Christian? Why or why not?
5. John B. Polhill wrote, "The word of God has triumphed--but not Paul. Paul was still in chains, still a prisoner. Throughout Acts the triumph was never with the bearers of the gospel. They were rejected, beaten, reviled, imprisoned, and killed for their witness. But the gospel was unfettered, triumphant." Was the gospel hindered by Paul's imprisonment or eventual death? How does the gospel still triumph if the bearers of the gospel do not? Explain.
6. What is one takeaway from today's message that you believe the Lord is prompting you to live out in your life?
