
We meet on the 4th Thursday of each month. No commitments, just bring yourself and your own beverage. Please come. - we'll have a fun time!

From the Pastor

When Plans Change

I recently went on a continuing education trip to Arizona for the ELCA 2023 Rostered Ministers Gathering. Sheltered by the air conditioning of the Phoenix Convention Center from the 115° heat, a group of almost 700 worshiped, had small group discussions, attended workshops, and generally rejuvenate and rekindle our hearts for ministry. That gathering had been postponed 3 years from when it had originally been planned, summer 2020, and that fact was pointed out more than once during our time together as a way that God had redirected us for a short time and a good reason for the joy and camaraderie we all felt at being together.

Well, unfortunately, all that togetherness changed my own plans, as I discovered a few days after leaving that I had contracted Covid at the Gathering. I had already flown to lowa to spend a few days at the tail end of my trip, but those few days ballooned into almost a week, as I fought the symptoms and quarantined and then my mom also came down with it. Thankfully, both of us recovered with little more than lingering fatigue, but that week definitely didn't turn out to be the time of relaxing reunion we had planned for.

Most of us hope for our plans to go off without a hitch, and we don't always give thanks when they do, but we are usually disappointed when they don't.

In Isaiah 55:8-9 the prophet wrote, "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts."

We do not know or understand the plans of God for us, nor should we. The plans we make and the paths we ultimately travel are a beautiful mixture of our best intentions, misguided hubris, daily choices, and God's gracious intervention.

Let us look toward the future with hope, making plans, but trusting that God's surely going to take our choices and chances, turn them around, and use them for His glory.

The program will consist of engrossing works by Mozart, Schubert, Mendelssohn, Brahms, Dvorak as well as Bela Bartok, Luigi Boccherini, Leo Janacek, Reinhold Gliere, Dimitri Shostakovich, Bedrich Smetana ad Ralph Vaughan Williams.

At the conclusion of the concert, all participants play together in a full string orchestra.

The Northern Lights Chamber Music Institute is the premiere educational wing of the Chamber Music Society of Minnesota, Young-Nam Kim and Arian Kim, Co-Artistic Directors.
