

From the Pastor

At the end of this month, with Ash Wednesday on February 22nd, we will begin the season of Lent.

Lent is one of those church seasons that people have strong opinions about. Some say it is too gloomy, too much focused on our sinfulness, too long a time to "prepare" for the joy of Easter. Others enjoy it as a time to refocus on God in their lives, give up harmful habits, or take on new practices that will help them grow personally or spiritually. Both opinions are valid and faithful.

As a professional church nerd, I find Lent to be an energizing time that provides more opportunities to participate in the faithful disciplines of self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love, guided by God's Word, Jesus's example, and the leading of the Holy Spirit.

This year, Gethsemane will be partnering with our neighbors across the street at Peace United Methodist Church to focus in on the last two disciplines – sacrificial giving and works of love – using the theme "Justice, Peace, and Wondrous Things: A Journey Through the Psalms with ELCA World Hunger," from their 40 Days of Giving program.

Here is how ELCA World Hunger describes the theme:

In the Psalms we will find the pleas of a people — our spiritual ancestors — for renewal and transformation, for justice and peace, and for hope and comfort.

We will read the psalmist's lament for the old Kingdom of David, which was reduced to rubble. We will read the yearning for safety and rest after the Israelites' experience of war and exile. We will read earnest prayers for a world where peace and justice reign and all are satisfied. And we will read outbursts of thankful praise for God, who restores the people, feeds all who hunger and "keeps faith forever" (Psalm 146:6).

As we gather on Wednesdays, we will be serving a soup and bread dinner, as we have done in past years, but this time it will be a Community Table meal, open and advertised to our whole neighborhood. We want to show the love of God to our neighbors through a hot meal and a warm welcome – no strings attached. After the meal at one church, everyone will be invited across the street for a service of prayer and reflection at the other church.


Sharing the work and the joy of serving one another between the two churches, our hope is to provide a meal and fellowship to feed the hunger of one another's bodies and hearts, and the Word to feed the hunger in all of our souls.

There will be devotional books available, along with a daily calendar to enrich our Lenten journey. Pastor Rob and I will be trading off leading the devotional services on Wednesdays at each of our churches, and we hope that you will join in participating, serving, and giving throughout the season.

In a world where suffering is always present, it's important to acknowledge that all of us, at one time or another, cry out for justice and peace, hope and comfort. As people of God, we are called to seek how we can be a part of God's response to those cries right here in our own neighborhood and all around the world.

May the Lenten season be a blessing to us, as we seek to be a blessing to others.

Schokolade Bakers

Our chocolate buffet is set for February 21, 2023 (known also as "Fat Tuesday" --- the day before Ash Wednesday.) We are asking food businesses in the area to donate chocolate items AND "home" bakers to share their specialties that have chocolate in the recipe(s). Bring uncut to church where we will cut/slice into sample sized pieces. We look forward to our patrons sampling as many different items as they wish.

Some "home" bakers may create layer cakes, fancy cupcakes, mini cream pies, etc. Many of us may work in teams creating cake pops, ice cream cone cupcakes, dipping chocolate covered items....which adds to the choices of our patrons. Consider some of your own favorites...or explore on Pinterest.

We do ask several things of you to help us:

- 1) Let us know if you are using tree nuts or peanuts in your recipe.
- 2) The health department will allow home bakers for this event only if you pledge to
- st Wash and sanitize the counter/work space. Keep pets in another room.
- * Wash your hands with warm water and soap before you handle ingredients/finished product.
- * When your hands are dry, wear food handler gloves (we have free gloves available in various sizes.)
- * Any items made with cream cheese cannot be made at home, though could be made at church.

What if 5 people each brings brownies? Love it!!! Each recipe has something special to it. And, thinking special ingredients... do you need something that you don't usually purchase—like Black cocoa? We may have this or can get it for you. Let us know. Can you bake something several weeks before the event and freeze it? Yes.

KIVA is a top US charity that connects loan money at 0% to applicants around the world and even in the USA. Many do not have access to 'traditional' sources of funding. People and groups apply for a loan to improve their life--- agricultural supplies, food to stock a small store, animals to sell, etc. They repay the loan. Repeat the process. Kiva does all the details. People provide the funds in \$25 increments. Borrowers' lives are improved. More info is available at KIVA.org. The KIVA administrative expenses are covered by grants, donations and a small fee added to each loan made. Over 2 million people have joined KIVA and provided almost 2 billion dollars in loans. The repayment rate is over 96% (currency exchange rates account for part of this.)

I am a KIVA member and just about to make choices for relending \$150. I have helped Norah in Kenya to purchase seeds and fertilizer, the Benkadi Group in Mali to purchase livestock for resale to other farmers, and a group in Senegal to establish a fish selling business, and others. My wife and I believe very strongly in social justice as a part of our religious beliefs. We do a lot to help locally and regionally. Kiva opens the door to helping others around the world.

The Generosity Team at Gethsemane has opted to do one event to help internationally with that choice being KIVA. The fund raiser is a chocolate dessert buffet. We call it Schokolade (German for "chocolate"). Sample pies, cakes, cheesecakes, cookies, make-your-own brownie sundaes, waffles, novelties, ice cream and a whole lot more. Drink coffee or hot chocolate as you have 2 hours to chat with friends and relax as you sample. Can't stay? Boxed sets of desserts will also be available. Tuesday, Feb. 21 from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. is also the date of Mardi Gras, or "Fat Tuesday." All profits will be invested in KIVA projects. You will be kept informed of what we do with the funds, who received funding, and how we reinvest year after year. We will share the projects of people helped by the Schokolade buffet event.

How can you help? Come to the event, bring friends, consider volunteering for an hour or two, and even possibly baking/making chocolate items. More information will be in our upcoming Sunday bulletins.

WARM YOUR HEART COMMUNITY CLOTHESLINE and FOOD PANTRY

The winter season is upon us! We are grateful that you are continuing to contribute to our Community Clothesline. Do you have extra jackets, shirts, sweatshirts, pants, shoes, T-Shirts, etc....? Now is the time to also bring winter jackets, warm socks, mittens, gloves, hats, blankets. Any type of clothing will be helpful.

You can help your neighbors by putting each item in a plastic bag to keep it dry, labeling it (example, "child hat, size M" or "men's jacket, size XL"), and clip it anywhere on the 'clothesline' [on the fence] on the west side of the church! (Clothespins are on site). The Community Clothesline is accessible at all times (24/7) from both the north and south parking lots.

We also have a Community Food Pantry next to the clothesline for putting nonperishable food items, personal care items, and paper products.

It has been great serving as your council president. Here is one of the things I will be doing with my free time.




