I was reminded of the beauty of Jesus' character and ministry as a servant leader. Here in Luke 12, Jesus is telling the disciples (and us) to continually be ready for His return. To be dressed for service and to keep our lamps burning. He even puts us into the role as servant leader as well. What a responsibility! And so, let us daily keep our relationship with Christ fresh and humbly put on our aprons, ready to serve others with the Gospel of Jesus and whatever needs they have. Let us be a great witness to the fact that Jesus, who has saved us, and who we follow, is returning soon to receive those who have their lamps burning and their light shining.
