
## HEROES OF THE FAITH

- The Molech Cult (vv. 1-5)
  - ❖ God forbade the sacrifice of human children to this Canaanite god.
  - ❖ 2 Kings 23:10/Jeremiah 32:35
  - ❖ This cult was a dreadful reality with Israel's neighbors.
  - \* This cultic worship was a danger to Israel.
  - ❖ Jezebel introduced this cult in the Northern Kingdom, during Ahab's reign.
  - ❖ Ahab ruled in Israel (Northern Kingdom) from 875BC − 853BC.
  - **❖** The LORD spoke to Moses. (vv. 1-5)
    - Any Israelite, or sojourner, who sacrificed his child to Molech would die. (v. 2)
    - ☐ All Jews would stone him to death.
    - ☐ God's judgment would be swift and complete. (v. 3)
      - o Focus: Misplaced worship.
      - o <u>Issue</u>: It defiled God's sanctuary and profaned His holy name. (Exodus 20:3-5, 34:14)
      - o Fall: Genesis 3:1-6
        - Misplaced worship
    - ☐ If Israel did not carry out God's judgment against the one, then God's wrath would expand. (vv. 4-5)
      - o God's judgment would impact the one, his family, and all who follow him.
      - He would ostracize them from Israel.
      - o Misplaced worship whoring after a Canaanite god God would not ignore.
- Miscellaneous sins (vv. 6-9)
  - ❖ If a person turned to mediums, wizards, or magicians God's judgment was severe. (v. 6)
  - ❖ God wanted a deep, real, & intimate relationship with His people. (vv. 7-8)
    - □ Exodus 20:3-5; 34:14 (v. 7)
    - One needed to consecrate himself for biblical worship.
    - ☐ Proper worship begins in your thought life. (v. 8; Romans 12:2)
    - ☐ Proper worship is carried out in your daily life thoughts lead to actions.
    - ☐ One must choose to honor God.
    - ☐ When he does, God sanctifies him. (Genesis 2:15; 1 Corinthians 10:31)
  - One who cursed his parents lost his life. (v. 9; Exodus 20:12)

*	Adultery (v. 10; Deuteronomy 22:22)
	<ul><li>□ A man slept with his neighbor's wife.</li><li>□ Both the adulterer and the adulteress would die by stoning.</li></ul>
*	<u>Incest</u> (vv. 11-12; 18:8)
	<ul> <li>□ A son lay with his father's wife. Both must die. (v. 11)</li> <li>□ A man lay with his daughter-in-law. Because of this perversion both must die. (v. 12)</li> </ul>
*	Homosexuality (v. 13; 18:22)
	<ul><li>□ A man lay with another man. Both must die for this perversion.</li><li>□ Romans 1:27</li></ul>
*	Incest (v. 14)
	<ul> <li>□ A man committed adultery with a woman &amp; her divorced, or widowed mother.</li> <li>□ Unique death penalty: Fire</li> </ul>
*	Bestiality (vv. 15-16; 18:23; Exodus 22:19; Deuteronomy 27:21)
	<ul> <li>☐ Man: Both the man and beast died. (v. 15)</li> <li>☐ Woman: Both the woman and beast died. (v. 16)</li> </ul>
*	<u>Incest</u> : A full, or half sister, was forbidden. But, it did not receive the death penalty. (v. 17) The prohibition of intercourse during menstruation was given earlier (15:19; 18:19). It is probable the phrase "cut off" does not mean execution. (v. 18) <u>Various cases of incest</u> (vv. 19-21)
	<ul> <li>□ Intercourse with one's aunt. (v. 19; chapter 18)</li> <li>□ Intercourse with an uncle's wife. The woman's penalty was childlessness. (v. 20)</li> <li>□ A man takes his brother's wife. The woman's penalty was childlessness. (v. 21)</li> </ul>

*	God called Israel to honor Him by obeying Him in the promised land. (vv. 22-23)
	<ul><li>☐ The morals and worship of the Canaanite nations were low.</li><li>☐ Exodus 20:3-5</li></ul>
	God demanded His people be different.
	God required His people have holy character. His character.
	<ul> <li>The core issue of godly character is lordship – the ownership of one's soul.</li> <li>"Character is the will to do what is right, as defined by God, regardless of the cost.</li> </ul>

		God created Eden for man in the beginning. (Genesis 2:8)
		God created the land of Canaan for Israel.
*	Go	d's cleanness laws. (vv. 25-26; chapter 11)
		He wisely regulated His people in all matters of life, practice, and worship. (v. 25; Deuteronomy 14:4-21)
		God commanded His people to be holy as He is holy. (v. 26; Exodus 19:6)
*	Go	d's penalty for the occult was high. (v. 27)
		Leviticus 19:26, 31; 20:6; Deuteronomy 18:11
		The cost was the same for both a man and woman.
		Pagan worship, mediums, spiritists, wizards, or magicians.
		When caught, death via stoning occurred.
