






First Christian Church will be distributing Thanksgiving Baskets this year on Saturday,

Highlights from the Board

At the September 13, 2023 Board meeting, the following items were discussed.

Betty Morris, Financial Secretary reported that income was under budget for August. She handed out budget work sheets to all committee chairs with the request that they be turned in by next board meeting.

Pastor Jeff Robinson reported that the average attendance for June was 122, July was 116 and August was 111. He reported that FCC will be hosting the short film "Where the River Divides" on October 18, 2023 at 7:00 pm. Mike Schrage from GNPI and Dennis Othok, whose story is told in the film, will be here for a time of fellowship and discussion. This will be an area wide event with the public and other churches invited. Pastor Jeff announced that the 3rd Wednesday Prayer meeting will move to the 2nd Wednesday so that more Board Members might attend.

The Board accepted the resignation of Patrick Corn from his dual position of Director of Worship and Director of Student Ministry.

Tammy Clark reported that Little Tree resumed on August 30 with 16 kids for their Welcome Back party. Angie Moore reported that SeekerGen students will attend FUSE at Rinehart Christian Church on October 22. They will utilize the Corn Maze.

Stage rennovation has begun. One of the refrigerators in the main building kitchen has been replaced due to it leaking. The laying of concrete on the parking area between the Main Building and the Fellowship Hall has begun. Approval was given for the Vernon County Historical Society to use the FCC parking lot for their Deepwood Cemetary tour.
