Highlights from the Board

At the March 13, 2024 Board meeting, the following items were discussed.

Church Report: Church attendance and giving were stable in February. Valentine's cards from Little Tree kids were delivered to seniors in nursing homes. Arrangements have been made for the pulpit to be filled through June.

The Worship Committee will feature special solos for Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday by Suzan Gaster and Sara Turley respectively.

The Property Committee reported that the Ford van is having issues. It has been sent for repair. We will check with the plumber to find out when the repair/reconstruction of the church's Main Building gas lines will occur.

The Youth Committee reported that SeekerGen may go skating later in March. They also may attend an FCA event at the Methodist Church hosted by the Cottey FCA (Fellowship of Christian Athletes).

The Pastor Search Committee reported that they met with Rick Callahan from Vanderbloeman last week. Four possible candidates were presented to the committee. The first round of zoom interviews have been completed for two of the candidates. After the next two, the committee will evaluate and do second interviews. They will probably invite one or two candidates to preach to the congregation. The Search Committee was given the authority to pay to bring candidates to visit with funds from the Sharp Fund, except for any candidate that requires international travel.

The Membership Committee reported that they helped with the Jo Testman funeral and will be helping with the Easter Breakfast. The van will run at the usual time on Easter Sunday.

And he walks with me, and he talks with me, And he tells me i am his own, And the joy we share as we tarry there, None other has ever known!







Fill in the horizontal rows using the clues. Then, using the number codes, complete the squares below to read three Beatitudes from Luke 6:20-21, NIV.
