Hi again.

While I was seeking inspiration for this month's newsletter, I came across this story from the life of Corrie ten Boom. Corrie ten Boom was a Dutch watchmaker, writer and Christian who helped hide and rescue Jews from the Nazis during World War II. Corrie ten Boom writes of an experience at the terrible Nazi Ravensbrück prison camp: "Together we entered the terrifying building. At a table were women who took away all our possessions. Everyone had to undress completely and then go to a room where her hair was checked. I asked a woman who was busy checking the possessions of the new arrivals if I might use the toilet. She pointed to a door, and I discovered that the convenience was nothing more than a hole in the shower-room floor. Betsie stayed close beside me at the time. Suddenly I had an inspiration, "Quick, take off your woolen underwear," I whispered to her. I rolled it up with mine and laid the bundle in the corner with my little Bible. The spot was alive with cockroaches, but I didn't worry about that. I felt wonderfully relieved and happy. "The Lord is busy answering our prayers, Betsie," I whispered. "We shall not have to make the sacrifice of all our clothes."

We hurried back to the row of women waiting to be undressed. A little later, after we had had our showers and put on our shirts and shabby dresses, I hid the roll of underwear and my Bible under my dress. It did bulge out obviously through my dress; but I prayed, "Lord, cause now Thine angels to surround me; and let them not be transparent today, for the guards must not see me." I felt perfectly at ease. Calmly I passed the guards. Everyone was checked, from the front, the sides, the back. Not a bulge escaped the eyes of the guard. The woman just in front of me had hidden a woolen vest under her dress; it was taken from her. They let me pass, for they did not see me. Betsie, right behind me, was searched.

But outside awaited another danger. On each side of the door were women who looked everyone over for a second time. They felt over the body of each one who passed. I knew they would not see me, for the angels were still surrounding me. I was not even surprised when they passed me by; but within me rose the jubilant cry, "O Lord, if Thou doest so answer prayer, I can face even Ravensbrück unafraid."

Every true believer in Jesus Christ should be encouraged and strengthened by what the Lord can and does do. Angels are watching over us. Angels are like superintendents of our lives and protect the interest of God, always working to promote God's plans and to bring about God's highest will for us. Angels are interested spectators and mark all we do. Here is an interesting thought; the Christian Walk is the primary concern of heaven and its angelic hosts. Paul said: "Before God and Christ Jesus and the angels who are his chosen, I solemnly charge you: maintain these rules, never prejudging the issue, but acting with strict impartiality." 1 Timothy 5:21. Paul was reminding Timothy the elect angels were constantly watching how he served Jesus Christ and lived the Christian life. What fact could provide a greater motivation to righteous living that that? In all that we say and do, we must remember the angels are watching and recording everything. Nothing escapes the eyes of the heavenly hosts. Nothing is trivial here on earth if heaven looks on.



# Job well done!

Fairview Center began participating in Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child shoebox evangelistic ministry in 2015, when Pastor Mark and Tina joined our congregation. Our goal that first year was 100 boxes. We exceeded that goal, packing 158 shoebox gifts that first year. The number of shoebox gifts we packed increased dramatically over the next several years.

"Shining His light to all corners of the world!



Over the past 11 years, Fairview Center has filled 6,632 shoeboxes with school supplies, clothing, a special toy and a variety of extra things to delight a child=simple gifts that can show God's unconditional love. Children around the world have heard the message of salvation through the shoebox gifts we have packed and prayed over. Some of the places our shoeboxes have been delivered include Zambia, Namibia, Madagascar, Nigeria, Chile, Trinidad-Tobago, Lesotho, South Africa and Congo.

Operation Christmas Child recipients who participate in the 12 week The Greatest Journey discipleship program often become bold disciple-makers sharing their faith with family and friends, in turn training others to do the same, leading to growth of believers and churches. This dynamic process is referred to as multiplication, where the impact of a single shoebox is magnified or multiplied as the Gospel message is spread through a network of individuals.

On average the impact of a single shoebox is ten persons rather than just the one recipient. This means through our shoebox gifts we have shared the message of Jesus with about 66.320 persons.

Continue to pray for the boxes' safe journey from our sanctuary to the hands of a child and for each child who will receive a box. (When they arrive at the church or other location for the event, they do not know they will receive a gift. They are invited to an event and will hear the Gospel but receiving a shoebox gift is a surprise.)
