Summary of Life

Dale L. Simonette was born on July 9, 1935, in Montgomery, to Leonard and Elsie (Polak) Simonette, and was baptized into the Christian faith, on August 11, by Rev. R. J. Bastyn. Dale graduated from Montgomery High School and entered the U.S. Navy, serving from 1953 -1956. After his service, he was delivering a car to Harley Meyer, when he noticed Harley's daughter, Eileen, sitting on the porch eating an apple. So began a lifetime love affair. Dale was taught and confirmed in the Christian faith by Rev. Martens at Friedens Evangelical Lutheran Church in Lanesburgh, on February 9, 1958. The following year, on October 5, 1959, Dale married Eileen at Friedens. The Lord blessed the couple with 3 children, and later with grandchildren and a great-granddaughter. He spent his career as a heavy-duty tow truck driver and was a member of the Teamsters Union.

Dale was a people-person, readily engaging in conversation with anyone he met. He thrived during the times spent with his grandchildren and enjoyed fishing-especially anywhere with his son, Paul. A good game of Euchre and going to garage sales filled other leisure activities. While Eileen was still alive, they enjoyed trips to Bayfield, WI, and many happy winters in Rockport, TX. After Eileen's untimely death from ALS, Dale also experienced health challenges, including a month-long stay at the VA Hospital, where he engaged nurses in conversations as to where all the best bakeries were! His optimism, sense of fun and love of people are sadly missed. On Sunday, August 10, 2025, the Lord called Dale Simonette at the age of 90 years, 1 month and 1 day.


