Sexagesima Sunday

Why the funny name? Those over 60 years old may remember historic Latin names for Sundays of the Church year—names which faded starting 50 years ago. “Sexagesima” comes from the Latin word for “sixtieth.” February 8 is about 60 days before Easter. (February 15 in the historic Western church calendar would be called “Quinquagesima Sunday”, representing roughly 50 days before Easter.) These names do not always align with a precise count of days but rather serve as symbolic markers. They represent a season of thoughtful transition from ordinary time toward the self-examination and repentance traditionally associated with Lent.

“There is a significant and growing appreciation for the historic rites of the Western Christian church, often driven by a desire for tradition, beauty, and deeper spiritual rootedness in an increasingly secularized world. This interest spans across ... communities, particularly among younger generations who are seeking tangible, sensory-rich worship experiences.

Many young adults are moving away from casual, contemporary worship in favor of ‘high church’ services that utilize historical confessions, incense, and traditional music. They are drawn to the mystery and stability that these ancient practices offer.”

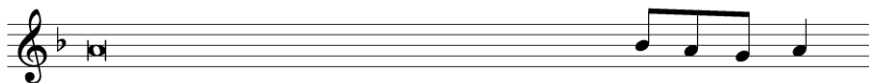

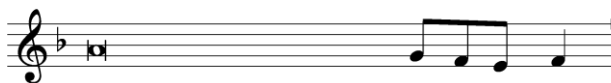

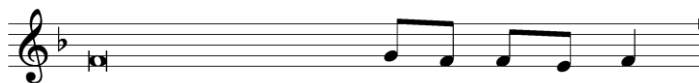

²⁴Because he received such a command, the jailer threw them into the inner prison and fastened their feet in the stocks.

²⁵About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them. ²⁶Suddenly there was such a violent earthquake that the foundations of the prison were shaken.
