

While they are still speaking, I will hear.



We'll make sure your donation gets to the Peace Center for our community needs. Please take one of the Community Meeting sheets (on the table) for ways to give to our community. On the table is SNAP and FISH info and links, too.

"This is the FISH Network's link for people to donate money for those needing help with food. Both FISH and Scott County links would be fine for us to use. People have other options, as well as donating food itself at Friedens, or designating special cash gifts to be sent through us.

This problem for our neighbors in need (42% of SNAP recipients in the county are minor children) is an opportunity for us to show God's love for our neighbors in tangible ways; 111 households in New Prague (that may be just the Scott County half of the city) use SNAP. Ten times as many use SNAP in Shakopee."
