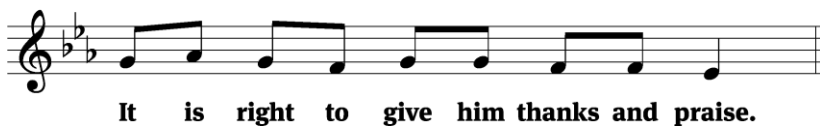
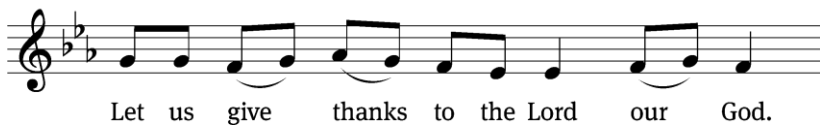
PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

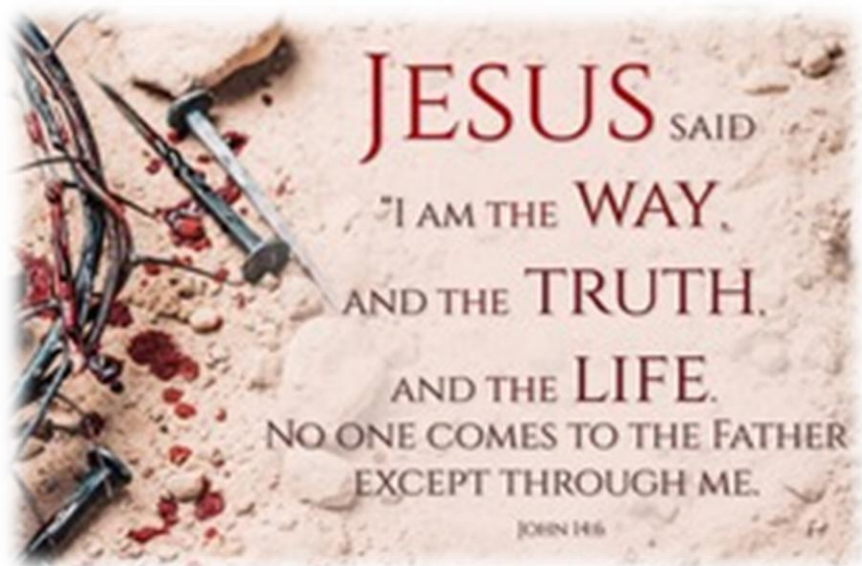
