By February 1936, after thirteen years of faithful giving, the church had paid off its debts. Growth continued with the establishment of the Bible Study School on December 14, 1947, holding its first meeting on January 11, 1948, with 98 people in attendance. Soon after, the Primitive Baptist Youth Fellowship was organized, and both groups continue to thrive spiritually and in number.

To meet growing needs, an Annex with eight Bible study rooms was completed in August 1950. In 1955, the Good Shepherd Window was installed behind the pulpit, dedicated "to the past and future Pastors." That same year, Elder T. Roe Scott began his ministry. During his pastorate, Brother Howard Cox was ordained — the first ordination in the church's history. After Elder Scott's retirement, he and his wife, Sister Evelyn, returned as beloved members, and an adult class now bears his name.

An addition to the Annex was completed in 1959, and the sanctuary underwent a remodeling in 1963–64, when the church was painted white — a bright symbol of renewal and grace.

Now, as we look upon this church, standing strong for well over a century, we are reminded of the faithful men and women who built it, sustained it, and filled it with love and prayer.

"For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God." — Ephesians 2:8–9

May all who gather here continue to experience God's sovereign, ruling, and reigning grace. When you find a church that supports, comforts, excites, and energizes you to do God's work — to Him be the glory — you have found a place with a truly Sweet History to which you can add your own memories.



A Sweet History of Faith and Fellowship

In 1891, under the leadership of Elder Millard Filmore (M.F.) Stubbs, sixteen devoted believers gathered with a shared vision — to establish a place of worship where they could meet as Primitive Baptists. With steadfast faith and the generosity of Dr. Holland, who donated land for the first building, their dream began to take shape.

That first church, located at South Main and Cherry Street, was soon destroyed by a storm. Undeterred, the congregation built again in 1894 on Vine Street, but after only one service, that building too was lost to another storm. Despite these trials, the members continued to meet faithfully at Field's Hall on Siebald and Courtland Streets, where in October 1896, the church was officially constituted and received into the Lower Canoochee Association.

In 1898, a third building was erected at Broad and Grady Streets, and by 1899, the congregation had grown to 56 members. Around 1910, the denomination faced division between the "Old-Liners" and "Progressives." The primary difference centered on the use of musical instruments, particularly the organ. The church chose the progressive path, purchasing its first organ in 1915, and during this same period, plans began for a brick church building. Membership flourished, increasing from 165 to 222.

Construction of the fourth church building began in 1923 on Zetterower Avenue. Despite the hardships of the Great Depression, the congregation trusted God to meet their financial needs. The cornerstone was laid on October 10, 1923, and the first service was held on September 13, 1924. The new building cost \$20,000, a significant investment in faith and community.

In 1920, before the new building was completed, a group of dedicated women met at the home of Mrs. S.F. Olliff and formed a Sewing Circle under the leadership of Mrs. F.I. Williams. Originally focused on good works through sewing, the group later became known as the Ladies Circle, turning their attention to Bible study. This ministry remains active today.
