Consider following up with your student later in the week with the following summary and discussion questions.

SUMMARY: MARK 11:11-25

When Jesus and the disciples arrived in Jerusalem, He took a look around, then headed back to Bethany for the night. The next day, He returned to the temple—but along the way, they had a strange encounter where Jesus cursed a fig tree for not having fruit on it. At the temple, Jesus started to overturn tables and chase out those who had turned the court of the Gentiles into a marketplace. It was supposed to be a place of worship, but it had become a place of business transactions. As they left the city, Peter noticed that the fig tree had completely withered. Just as the tree was destroyed for its lack of fruit, the religious system was destined to fail because it was no longer serving its purpose.
