Consider following up with your student later in the week with the following summary and discussion questions.

SUMMARY: MARK 15:24-39

Crucifixion was the most humiliating, painful way that a person could die. The Romans used it to "keep the peace" in their empire by showing onlookers exactly what they could look forward to if they rebelled. Jesus was crucified between two criminals, even though He was not a criminal. At the moment of His death, He took on all the sins of humanity, even though He was free from sin, and through His sacrifice, He paid the price that we could never pay. As He was dying, darkness covered the land, and at the moment of His death, the veil in the temple was supernaturally torn in half. The division between God and humans was destroyed, once and for all.

discussion questions

•01 What part of the story of Jesus's death sticks with you the most?

.02 What do you think the centurion saw that finally convinced him about Jesus's true identity?

PRAY: Take some time thanking God the Father and God the Son for the ultimate sacrifice they made for us through the cross. Ask Him to deepen your understanding of what the cross means for you and all of humankind.
