family DEVOTION

Consider following up with your student later in the week with the following summary and discussion questions.

SUMMARY: MARK 16:1-16,19-20

Some of the women who had followed Jesus went to His tomb early in the morning after the Sabbath. They were surprised to find the heavy stone rolled away from the door, and even more alarmed when they discovered that His body was missing! An angel told them to not be afraid: their Lord had risen! Jesus began to appear to His followers: first to Mary Magdalene, then to two disciples talking together as they walked down the road. At first, no one believed this reports, but then Jesus appeared to His eleven disciples and rebuked them for not believing. He gave them an important task: to go into the world and spread the gospel wherever they went.

discussion QUESTIONS

How do you think the disciples were changed when they saw the risen Jesus? Why did they not believe at first?

What are some ways that you can go into the world and share the gospel as Jesus calls His followers to do?

PRAY: Thank God that Jesus did not remain dead, but rose and was victorious over sin and death. Thank Him for including you in His plan to share this good news with all the world, and ask Him to show you how you can play your part.
